MINUTES OF THE CALLED MEETING/WORKSHOP, AND THE REGULAR SESSION OF COUNCIL MEETING OF SEPTEMBER 14th, 2017

- 1. Mayor Bass called to order the called meeting/workshop at 4:51 pm. Roll was taken: Mayor Bass, Mayor Pro Tem Gary Lucas, Hal Wilcox, Allen Trigg, Frank Holt, and Jason Dean, all in attendance. City Administrator Koni Billings in attendance. 2.
- 2. TXDOT representatives and PSC project manager in attendance.

Items listed under the regular council session were to deal with streets that are nearly impassable, made so by the constant traffic from PSC trucks, TXDOT trucks and the sub-contractors hauling rocks road base etc. These heavy trucks have decimated Market Street from FM 107 to the southbound service lanes on IH-35 exiting from Market Street and Pine Street. TXDOT and PSC were asked to come up with a solution as they had been constant in their use from the time that the Blevins Bridge came down until today's date. Also on the table for discussion was Bruce, 1st street, Grider and Church streets. These have taken tremendous traffic use from interstate closings and truck traffic building all of the Bruceville improvements in the expansion project. TXDOT and PSC will drive the affected streets and let us know, for contingency plans will be necessary in order for street budget to cover at the minimum, Market Street. We have a 380 contract agreement with a new business to have a parking lot installed and to do so; Market will need a complete rebuild first. The request for a traffic study on FM 107 and the variables in speed was addressed once again. Jacob Chau will get back to us with a date to visit. The department asked for the city to consider implementation of an Ordinance which would lower the construction speed limit to 60. The concern of Ms. Billings was that the two cities that have created traffic speed restrictions on the project are Home Rule. And our city is General Law Type A. Jacob is looking into a template that could be used for a General Law city. Mr. Wilcox asked to have a study that will include the cost factor of undertaking a traffic study from the east city limits to the west limits along 7 and 107 highways. A time line for that study and any legal work involved will need to be made. Meeting adjourned at 6:10 pm.

REGULAR SESSION OF THE COUNCIL MEETING OF SEPTEMBER 14th, 2017

- 1) Regular Session of Council was called to order at 6:31 pm. Roll was taken. All councilmembers in attendance, City administrator in attendance.
- 2) Prayer was offered by Councilman Jason Dean, who then led the Pledge of Allegiance.
- Citizen Time: Michael Johansen of 18615 IH-35 spoke on his feelings of what the council needs to undertake to educate the employees that work for the city by producing a manual with answers to all the possible questions that they could be asked, and a roster of their daily duties. Mr. Johansen noted that he had asked for public information to be distributed and that it took four weeks to get it all back and that he was actually asked to pay for it from his hard earned money. He noted that the code enforcement officer did not have authority to enforce the "codes" as he did not know them. He stated that he was confronted and was spoken to in an aggressive manner, and that he was told to go to city hall to find out what he had been charged with, and that no one at city hall could tell him what he had been charged with. He exceeded his time for citizen's time and was asked to close. (Councilmen were unable to respond, or rebut as this was done under citizen time, which does not allow for discussion of items not on an agenda.)

"City Engineer Report: Mr. Tabor had no items for discussion. The meeting to analyze the 5) hydrostatics study, and the CDBG progress and the Falls County, Old Bethany roads study was scheduled for September 21st 2017 at 5:00 pm.

Public Works: approval of a used truck purchase to replace WT-103, which has 300,000 miles on it, and is not working at this time. Truck is 2011 Ford Heavy Duty for \$11,500.00. Hal Wilcox made motion to purchase, second was made by Gary Lucas. All in Favor. A motion for approval of the contractor that will fulfill the CDBG work, B-Corp, was made by Gary Lucas, seconded by Jason to assign this work to B-Corp, who has won the bidding for the project.

Police Department: No business, however, Mr. Lucas and Mayor Bass both spoke on the two 7) officers that responded to the hurricane disaster in Houston, Rockport, and Fulton area and praised their acts. The two officers that went to the area were Chief McLean and Corporal Millsap, who was the attending bailiff

He has done his inspections; he does not have his certificate yet. Ms. Billings gave Mr. Moser an application to rezone. No motion needed.
