RE: FOSTER BRANCH ESTATES ADDITION (Lots 1-6)

Dear Mrs. Bishop,

Yesterday we received the latest draft of the proposed plans for water service to Lots 1-6 of the Foster Branch Estates Addition. Unfortunately, it appears the City of Bruceville-Eddy has made the choice to continue their arbitrary and capricious water line placement design for service to Lots 1-6 even though Creekside has spent additional funds in engineering and survey costs to provide the City with additional specific information and data requested.


This latest proposed plan (which does not appear to have changed at all from the original design proposed in October 2020, which was not approved, despite the additional \$5,400 engineering fee requirement) once again requires additional land to be unnecessarily used for this water line despite an existing 30-foot utility easement, creates an additional environmental impact through the unnecessary destruction of additional trees, and increases overall costs. Please let us know what the additional \$5400 cost has been spent on if it has been spent already.

While non-sensical explanations have been attempted towards the idea of the City's unwillingness to place their waterline infrastructure into easements where other utilities may be present, the current proposed design demonstrates a different reality. As you are aware, there are presently water meters and services lines installed within the dedicated 30ft utility easement on Lots 7-22 of Foster Branch Estates Addition. In fact, the current proposed design has portions of the City's proposed water infrastructure located within the 30ft easement and once again dispels the notion the City is unwilling to place infrastructure within a normal common easement. What can possibly be a legitimate rationale for not the keeping the remaining line within the 30 ft utility easement once your line enters the 30 ft utility easement (the same way you normally install lines in the city easements)? Why do you want to destroy more trees unnecessarily?

Please take corrective action to reposition the proposed new 4" extension to "align" with the adjoining Remington Ranch existing line for a "continuous line" look without the unnecessary angles beyond those required to remain adjacent to the Remington Circle right-of-way. The accurate identification of installed electrical poles as requested should provide ample design flexibility to align the 4" line continuously without electrical poles disrupting the line placement. We had the electrical poles installed in advance of your line to make sure there was no conflict; you can now proceed within the 30 ft easement without conflict as the electric poles are in place.

Burdening the property with an additional 20ft easement, where such easement placement would be contrary to alignment with existing service lines installed within a public easement adjacent to existing road right-of-way, is still not conducive to sound land development practices and destroys more trees. We simply request the waterline be installed with common and sound practices, please help us get that done.
