City Administrators report August 12, 2021

7/30/2021 3:18 PM I received an email from James Muela in response to my email. Mr. Muela said After Creekside proposed engineering alternatives that could be mutually agreeable, we presented the options to Johnny Tabor. Johnny asked if Creekside was willing to make certain adjustments to the proposed engineering alternatives, and we relayed his request to counsel for Creekside. We did not receive a response, so I followed up with Creekside's attorney, Kent Wymore. Kent apologized for the delay and let me know that his father had passed away suddenly earlier this month. Kent said he would have a response for us soon.

He will keep me updated as soon as we hear Creekside's response to Johnny Tabor's request.

8/5/2021 5:22 AM I emailed Mr. Muela to ask if there are any updates. In his response email he stated they have not received any word from Kent Wymore. He's been our main point of contact, but I will reach out to another attorney for Creekside, Scott Field, to move the case forward. I will keep you updated as soon as I am able to get in touch with Scott.

I will be posting the agenda for the Sewer meeting on August 18 at 5:30 PM. Mr. Tabor has agreed to attend. During this meeting, we will be giving an update on the letter of conditions for the sewer.

The utility agreement has been with the attorneys. I emailed Stephanie Swuab and Mr. Pirkle on 8/4/2021 and have not heard back as of 8-5-2021

The expected time frame for the handicap parking should start early September.

The bulletproof glass remains an issue. Glass Doctor of Hewitt is again not returning calls. I called on 8/2/2021 and left messages. Mike Phelps came into the office at the begging of July and said he would have the glass in four weeks. He said the manufacturer cut the glass wrong.

The ordinances have been emailed to Franklin and should be updated in our system very soon.

8/4/2021 8:32 PM Mr. Thomas emailed me requesting to have a meeting with Kayla Landeros and him. He stated he would need about two hours to talk about updates in the ordinances that are necessary. Mr. Thomas confused our council dates with the City of Temple and asked to be on the August 19th agenda. I explained our meetings are on the 2nd and 4th Thursday. He asked if I would get a date from the council and let him know.

With the time he is requesting, it may be better to call a special meeting for his presentation.

The maintenance and water guys have been working hard on getting areas cleaned up and getting potholes cleaned out. We are tracking street patching in our software system. I am working with Incode to have street repairs added to the report Gene provides monthly.

8/4/2021 a person not living in the city limits or on our water supply came into the office asking to speak with me while I was in a meeting. Very shortly after I began receiving phone calls from a well-known gun activist and was threatened that he can either help me or hurt me. This person called me numerous more times. They have an issue with the signage on the court window about prohibiting guns in the court. The judge amended his order for permitted license to carry to avoid any further conflict.

Chief Dorsey reported back in March Officer Roman did a traffic stop and recovered a large amount of money (\$39,955.30) we filed all our reports and paper work and we were just notified that the police department will be receiving \$27,710.51 which will be deposited in the asset forfeiture account.

Most of y'all know the history of me here and you also know about a year and a half ago we were just starting on this facility. During that time, I was accused of a criminal act and that was pretty serious stuff and we proved that wrong. Now it has raised its head up again and I have been indirectly accused of that same crime by a council member. I don't appreciate that and I don't think we should go down this road again. I stopped that road before and I am afraid I won't stop it again. I don't want to hear any of it in public and when I hear it, I get upset. Re: Updated Proposal: Water well at Brass Valley on CR 451 at CR 456, Eddy, TX

Chee,

As we have been discussing, the Stephan Family Living Trust (SFLT) is agreeable to donating a 300-foot by 300-foot parcel in the Northwest corner of the SFLT Brass Valley property located on Falls County Road 451 near the intersection of CR-456 for a Bruceville-Eddy Water well and pump station (B-E Water). These dimensions INCLUDE portions of both Falls CR-451 and the 30-foot ingress and egress easement discussed below.

Along the property line that runs Northwest to Northeast, will be a 30-foot ingress and egress easement. This easement allows B-E Water access from both the CR-451 frontage and the easement, while at the same time allowing SFLT and Brass Valley access to our adjacent properties that share this same fence line. This easement is to remain unfenced. B-E Water agrees to maintain their portion of the ingress/egress easement.

We understand that the water plant will contain well head, pump house, storage tanks, filtration systems and other associated water pumping and treating equipment. B-E Water agrees that any storage tanks or other structures will be limited to the same 24-foot height as the current water plant on CR-457. B-E Water agrees there will be no sewage facilities of any type associated with this property. B-E Water agrees to the filing of restrictive covenants enforcing height restriction(s), fencing restriction(s), and sewage restrictions on the parcel.

A survey will be required of the B-E Water parcel, including the ingress and egress easement. This survey will be the responsibility of the City of Bruceville-Eddy and paid for by B-E Water. Copies of the survey will be furnished as both printed and AutoCAD (dwg) files submitted to the Stephan Family Living Trust at closing. The survey completed by Mitchell and Associates/Waco in February of 2021 for SFLT is available in both .pdf and .dwg format to B-E Water for planning purposes.

It is understood that Oncor Energy will install upgraded power to the water supply station, and that a power pole for electrical power will be on the Southwest property line shared by both B-E Water and SFLT, allowing SFLT access to upgraded electrical power for a future shop.

Bruceville-Eddy Water agrees to indemnify SFLT from any damages caused by the drilling of their well. This would include damages to the SFLT stock tank from contamination caused or contributed to by drilling the water well or for interruption of flow into the stock tank and shallow wells already on the site. Should either shallow well fail due to B-E Water drilling their well, or to meet TCEQ water quality restrictions, B-E Water agrees to furnish water at no cost to the SFLT.

A combination of a trade involving 3 water meter tap fees plus some form of monetary compensation is the starting point for negotiations. It is anticipated that both parties will negotiate compensation through either exchange of services and/or monetary compensation for the land.

Sonya,

I do not believe the City has any obligation to actively enforce the building codes or have a City building inspector. If the City passes building codes, they need to be in compliance with Chapter 214 of the Local Government Code, which has adopted the International building codes. That chapter grants the City the power to pass ordinances adopting those codes and enforce those codes, but does not require that the City actually do so. Thus, the City can choose to not have a building inspector or even forgo requiring building permits or inspections at all. The building codes can still remain in place, it just becomes up to the owners/builders to make sure they are meeting them.

If the City still wants to have some oversight even without a City inspector, such as through issuance of permits and submission of inspections, I do not believe there is anything specific the City must collect or require be submitted. Certain types of inspections do require licensed inspectors (e.g. a plumbing inspection), and if the City intends to require owners or builders submit their own inspections you would probably want to include requirements that they be licensed. The City would still want clear guidelines of what must be submitted so that it can be enforced uniformly, but I think the City has the discretion to decide what it needs to see to approve the permit so long as it has some rational basis for doing so.

As an additional note, if the City will still require a permit fee, chapter 214 does place some limitations on how that fee is calculated:

Sec. 214.907. Prohibition on Certain Value-Based Building Permit and Inspection Fees.

- a. In determining the amount of a building permit or inspection fee required in connection with the construction or improvement of a residential dwelling, a municipality may not consider:
 - 1. the value of the dwelling; or
 - 2. the cost of constructing or improving the dwelling.
- b. A municipality may not require the disclosure of information related to the value of or cost of constructing or improving a residential dwelling as a condition of obtaining a building permit except as required by the Federal Emergency Management Agency for participation in the National Flood Insurance Program.

There are also timing requirements for the issuance of a permit. This sections also requires the City provide written notice why a permit was denied, so the City will still need to be able to articulate why a permit is denied even if it did not perform the inspection.

Sec. 214.904. Time for Issuance of Municipal Building Permit.

- a. This section applies only to a permit required by a municipality to erect or improve a building or other structure in the municipality or its extraterritorial jurisdiction.
- b. Not later than the 45th day after the date an application for a permit is submitted, the municipality must:
 - 1. grant or deny the permit;
 - 2. provide written notice to the applicant stating the reasons why the municipality has been unable to grant or deny the permit application; or
 - 3. reach a written agreement with the applicant providing for a deadline for granting or denying the permit.
- c. For a permit application for which notice is provided under Subsection (b)(2), the municipality must grant or deny the permit not later than the 30th day after the date the notice is received.
- d. If a municipality fails to grant or deny a permit application in the time required by Subsection (c) or by an agreement under Subsection (b)(3), the municipality:
 - 1. may not collect any permit fees associated with the application; and
 - 2. shall refund to the applicant any permit fees associated with the application that have been collected.

If the City will still require an inspection to be obtained and paid for by the owner/builder, what are the requirements for that inspection and how will the City verify that the requirements have been met?



I hope this letter finds you in good health and spirit. This letter is being written in response to your letter dated February 24, 2021. After receiving your letter, the city council discussed at the February 25, 2021 city council meeting the meter study for the Robin Road property. Jay and Suzee Stewart, your son -in-law and daughter, participated in the discussion and confirmed they would pay for the recommended meter study upgrades. Also, Mr. and Mrs. Stewart stated if the project exceeded the estimated \$20,000.00, they would pay the difference.

On February 23, 2021, the city engineer determined upgrades needed to install a meter at this location. Referring back to your letter to us, the upgrades completed in May 2019 did not include the Robin Road area. The city engineer estimated the upgrades costing \$20,000.00; however, on April 6, 2021, the sealed bids were opened, and the lowest bid was by Bruce Flanigan Construction for \$45,540.00 plus engineer fees, advertisement fees, meter installation cost with a total project cost of \$53,224.78 less the previous payment of \$3,800.00 leaving a balance of \$49,424.78. The price increase is due to limited workspace because of only having 10-foot easements. This bid is good for 30 days from April 6, 2021. Please let us know how you would like to proceed.

Your letter stated there is an exposed water line on your property. The city administrator instructed the water staff to correct this issue; however, a text message was sent from Jay Stewart to our water supervisor on April 5, 2021 that no one is permitted to be on the property, per James Killough.

The city was then notified on April 6, 2021 that TCEQ had been notified by the property owner reporting exposed distribution waterlines. The city is unable to repair the exposed waterlines without a water easement.
