RESOLUTION NO. 3-23-2023-1

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BRUCEVILLE-EDDY, TEXAS GRANTING CONSENT TO THE CREATION OF A MUNICIPAL UTILITY DISTRICT AND THE INCLUSION OF LAND THEREIN

WHEREAS, the City of Bruceville-Eddy, Texas (the "City") received a Petition for Consent to the Creation of a Municipal Utility District from the owners of the land described in Exhibit "A" (the "Land") attached hereto; and

WHEREAS, a portion of the Land is currently located within the extraterritorial jurisdiction of the City; and

WHEREAS, Section 42.042 of the Texas Local Government Code provides that land within a city's extraterritorial jurisdiction may not be included within a municipal utility district without the city's consent; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to grant consent to the creation of the municipal utility district and the inclusion of the Land in the district; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BRUCEVILLE-EDDY, TEXAS, as follows:

<u>Section 1</u>. The facts and opinions in the preamble of this Resolution are true and correct.

<u>Section 2</u>. The City Council of the City hereby grants its written consent to the creation of a municipal utility district and the inclusion of the Land in such district, whether such land is currently within the City's extraterritorial jurisdiction or becomes part of the City's extraterritorial jurisdiction in the future.

<u>Section 3</u>. The District is authorized to exercise all powers granted to a municipal utility district, or which may be hereafter granted, in the legislation creating the District and under the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas.

Section 4. It is hereby found, determined and declared that a sufficient written notice of the date, hour, place, and subject of this meeting of the City Council was posted at a place convenient to the public at the City Hall of the City for the time required by law preceding this meeting, as required by the Open Meetings Law, Chapter 551, Texas Government Code, and that this meeting has been open to the public as required by law at all times during which this Resolution and the subject matter thereof has been discussed, considered and formally acted upon. The City

Council further ratifies, approves, and confirms such written notice and the contents and posting thereof.

<u>Section 5</u>. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and adoption.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF BRUCEVILLE-EDDY, TEXAS, ENACTING A CURFEW FOR MINORS, IMPOSING CRIMINAL LIABILITY UPON PARENTS, GUARDIANS OR ESTABLISHMENT OWNERS WHO PERMIT VIOLATION OF CURFEW, ESTABLISHING A PENALTY FOR VIOLATION OF THE ORDINANCE, REPEALING ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH, PROVIDING FOR REVIEW, PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BRUCEVILLE-EDDY:

SECTION 1. CURFEW HOURS FOR MINORS

- (1) <u>Curfew Hours means</u>:
 - (a) 10:00 p.m. on any Sunday, Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, or Thursday until 6:00 a.m. of the following day;
 - (b) 12:01 a.m. until 6:00 a.m. on any Friday or Saturday and
 - (c) 8:00 a.m. until 3:40 p.m. on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, or Friday.

(2) <u>Emergency</u> means an unforeseen combination of circumstances or the resulting state that calls for immediate action. The term includes, but is not limited to, a fire, a natural disaster, an automobile accident, or any situation requiring immediate action to prevent serious bodily injury or loss of life.

(3) <u>Establishment</u> means any privately owned place of business operated for a profit to which the public is invited, including but not limited to any place of amusement or entertainment.

- (4) <u>Guardian</u> means:
 - (a) A person who, under court order, is the guardian of the person of a minor; or
 - (b) A public or private agency with whom a minor has been placed by a court.

(5) <u>Minor</u> means any person under 17 years of age.

(6) <u>Operator</u> means any individual, firm, association, partnership, or corporation operating, managing, or conducting any establishment. The term includes the members or partners of an association or partnership and the officers of a corporation.

(7) <u>Parent means a person who is:</u>

(a) A natural parent, adoptive parent, or step-parent of another person; or

(b) At least 18 years of age and authorized by a parent or guardian to have the care and custody of a minor.

(8) Public Place means any place to which the public or a substantial group of the public has access and includes, but is not limited to, streets, highways, and the common areas of schools, hospitals, apartment houses, office buildings, transport facilities, and shops.

- (9) Remain means to:
 - (a) Linger or stay; or
 - (b) Fail to leave premises when requested to do so by a police officer or the owner, operator, or other person in control of the premises.

(10) Serious Bodily Injury means bodily injury that creates a substantial risk of death or that causes death, serious permanent disfigurement, or protracted loss of impairment of the function of any bodily member or organ.

SECTION 2. OFFENSES

(1) A minor commits an offense if he remains, walks, runs, stands, drives or rides about in or upon any public place or on the premises of any establishment within the city during curfew hours.

(2) A parent or guardian of a minor commits an offense if he or she knowingly permits, or by insufficient control allows the minor to remain, walk, stand, drive, or ride about in or upon any public place or on the premises of any establishment within the city during curfew hours.

(3) The owner, operator, or any employee of an establishment commits an offense if he knowingly allows a minor to remain, walk, run, stand, drive or ride about in or upon the premises of the establishment during curfew hours.

SECTION 3. DEFENSES

- (1) It is a defense to prosecution under Section 2 that the minor was:
 - (a) Accompanied by the minor's parent or guardian;
 - (b) On an errand at the direction of the minor's parent or guardian, without any detour or stop;
 - (c) In a motor vehicle involved in interstate travel;
 - (d) Engaged in an employment activity, or going to or returning home from an employment activity, without any detour or stop;
 - (e) Involved in an emergency;

- (f) On the sidewalk abutting the minor's residence or abutting the residence of a next-door neighbor if the neighbor did not complain to the police department about the minor's presence.
- (g) Attending an official school, religious or other recreational activity supervised by adults and sponsored by the City of Bruceville-Eddy, Bruceville-Eddy Independent School District, a civic organization, or another similar entity that takes responsibility for the minor, or going to or returning home from, without any detour or stop, an official school, religious, or other recreational activity supervised by adults and sponsored by the City of Bruceville-Eddy, Bruceville-Eddy Independent School District, civic organization, or another similar entity that takes responsibility for the minor;
- (h) Exercising First Amendment rights protected by the United States Constitution, such as the free exercise of religion, freedom on speech, and the right of assembly; or
- (i) Married or had been married or had disabilities of minority removed in accordance with Chapter 31 of the Texas Family Code.

(2) It is a defense to prosecution under Section 2 that the owner, operator, or employee of an establishment promptly notified the police department that a minor was present on the premises of the establishment during the curfew hours and refused to leave.

(3) It is a defense to prosecution under Section 2 with respect to the curfew hours of 8:00 a.m. until 3:40 p.m. on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday or Friday, that the offense occurred during the scheduled vacation of or on a holiday observed by the school in which the minor is enrolled; or that the minor has graduated from high school or received a high school equivalency certificate; or that the minor has permission to be absent from the school or be in a public place from an authorized school official or a parent or guardian; or that the minor is enrolled in an alternative school program requiring daily hours of attendance other than between the hours of 8:00 a.m. until 3:40 p.m. In the case of a minor being educated in a home school, a parent or guardian shall be deemed a school official.

Before taking any enforcement action under this Ordinance, a police officer shall ask the apparent offender's age and reason for being in the public place. The officer shall not issue a citation or make an arrest under this Ordinance unless the officer reasonably believes that an offense has occurred and that, based on any response and other circumstances, no defense in Section 3 is applicable.

SECTION 5. PENALTIES

(1) A person who violates a provision of this Ordinance is guilty of a separate offense for each day or part of a day during which the violation is committed, continued, or permitted. Each offense, upon conviction, is punishable by a fine not to exceed five hundred dollars (\$500.00). When required by Section 51.08 of the Texas Family Code, as amended, the municipal court shall waive original jurisdiction over a minor who violates Section 2
(1) of this Ordinance and shall refer the minor to juvenile court.

SECTION 6. REVIEW OF CURFEW ORDINANCE

This Ordinance shall be reviewed every third year prior to 03-23-2026 of such year as required by Section 370.002 of the Texas Local Government Code. The first review shall be conducted no later than 02-23-2026, and every third year thereafter. Such review shall be conducted following a public hearing regarding the need to continue the Ordinance and the City Council shall have the option to continue, abolish or modify the Ordinance based upon their review of the Ordinance's effects on the community and on the problems the Ordinance is intended to remedy.

SECTION 7. REPEALER

All provisions of the ordinances of the City of Bruceville-Eddy in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed, and all other provisions of the ordinances of the City of Bruceville-Eddy, not in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance, shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 8. SEVERABILITY

It is the intention of the City Council that this Ordinance, and every provision thereof, shall be considered severable and the invalidity of any section, clause or provision or part or portion of any section, clause, or provision of this Ordinance shall not affect the validity of any other portion of this Ordinance.

SECTION 9. EFFECTIVE DATE

This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its passage and publication as required by law.

City Administrators Report: 3/23/2023

Sewer System

At our 3/23/2023 Council will be considering the approval of a bond ordinance for the intial sewer loan; a process that began in January with the approval of the official legal notice language. We have been in a mandatory 45 day waiting period before we can officially approve the ordinance. As a reminder, this certificate of obligation will NOT allow us to pay for the entire sewer system. We will need to await bids before we have an opportunity to address the shortfall in funding. It should also be noted that the approval of the bond ordinance does not obligate us to the USDA loan at this point, that will come a bit further down the road with the closure of the loan that is still expected to take place in late Spring or early Summer according to my last conversation with Terri.

Mayor Owens and I have requested an official meeting with USDA Regional and State offices to meet with Tabor and Associates as well as the CEO of BVRT to further discuss the feasibility of a public-private partnership on the WWTP for our project. We are waiting to hear back on potential dates for this meeting before moving forward with the conversation.

Grants Updates

The deadline to submit applications for CDBG projects has been extended to May to give entities more time to work through survey requirements. We are currently working with three remaining residents to complete a survey that will help determine if we have enough low to moderate income beneficiaries included in the project to move forward.

The Mayor, staff, and Scott Murrah of 5M Associates met with regional TXDOT staff on 3/3/2023 to discuss our Transportation Alternatives preliminary grant application for the sidewalk leading from downtown to the schools and City Hall. Representatives with TXDOT seemed to like our project and thought it had merit. They had several suggestions on how to better shore up an official application should we be invited to apply. Invitations for this grant application are expected to be sent out at the end of March with a June deadline. It should be noted, that while Bruceville-Eddy is eligible for 100% funding on this project, the grant would be a federal reimbursement grant which would require us to budget and expend funds BEFORE requesting reimbursement for the eligible expenses form the Federal government.

Springfest

Efforts are now underway for the planning of the second annual Springfest which will be set for 5/6/2023, with some events occurring the week leading up to that Saturday. The McGruer family, headed up by Mrs. Cherie McGruer, has taken the lead for the efforts this year and has already hosted initial meetings with City staff and the community over the past week. If anyone is interested in helping as a volunteer or contributor to the events, please reach out to her directly.

Online and In-Person Credit/Debit Payment Solution

Our new electronic credit payment system was implemented with only a slight hiccup at the beginning of the month. A big kudos to Esther for heading up this project's rollout! Staff have been working with customers to get them up to speed on the new online system and inform them of its increased features and benefits. We have already taken plenty of credit/debit card payments in house as well which has been a welcomed improvement by several residents! We hope our customers will enjoy the decreased processing cost they are now seeing with these transactions as well as their ability to see the amount owed in the online payment portal. Even more features will be coming to this system over the next year or so according to our rep and we are excited about the possibilities!

While we had budgeted \$2,000 for the implmentation of this new system this year, to date we have not had any out-of-pocket expenses as we already had the functional integration modules with our current billing software system!

Development

CREED:

On 2/15/2023 the Mayor, Pam and I met with developers who have only recently finalized the sale of land formerly belonging to James Construction in Falls County. CREED plans on building a truck stop at this location with an RV park around the retention pond that is currently located on the property. They also spoke to the desire to potentially build out enough retail space to host a small grocery store to serve residents of BE as well as the RV park. We have provided the team at CREED with the next steps to get their property replated and rezoned as well as establish water service. As of today we have not yet heard back from them and all plans are simply a concept at this point.

BE Travel Center:

We are waiting on a submitted plat and zoning change request form to proceed. A couple weeks ago RSK Engineering inquired about general timelines for the approval process to which we responded.

CEFCO:

We are waiting a submitted plat application form to proceed. Guy Slimp mentioned in our last conversation they are beginning talks with TXDOT as well as BEISD for vehicle access along the frontage road and Miracle Lane.

Sewer System

I requested an update for the sewer system from Terri a couple weeks ago and was met with a cordial, but disappointing response. Everything is still currently under review by their legal team, although she mentioned that we are probably now looking at a 'late spring to early summer loan closing realistically'. On this topic, the Mayor and I have received a term sheet proposal from BVRT on the potential public-private partnership for the WWTP I have previously



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mentioned. We have a few questions that need to be answered before we can move forward, but we are not seeing any major deal breakers at this point. We plan on setting up a joint meeting with USDA to talk feasibility over the next few weeks. I have already reached out to Johnny Tabor, and he is open to meeting alongside us to help ensure the city is properly protected in any dealings we consider.

The next action on the sewer system will be the approval of the bond ordinance at the 3/23/2023 City Council meeting.

CDBG Project

5M Associates has completed preliminary construction cost estimates for our CDBG application and unfortunately for the scope of work, things are not looking good... Apparently, not even \$500,000 does what it did 5 years ago! As you know, we were studying replacing lines along Horseshoe Bend and the alleyway in-between 3rd and 4th streets. However, not only do we not have enough money in this budget to complete both projects, but we will need to reduce the scope of a single project as well!

I have discussed the issue with Gene, the Mayor, and our consulting representatives engaged on the project and we believe the best project to move forward with will be the line replacement in the alleyway. This line (currently galvanized steel which may potentially contain lead) is in constant need of repair and may need to be replaced down the road regardless of condition due to updated lead and copper rules coming down from the EPA.

Our partnering companies will continue to work this proposed project and we will set aside upgrades to Horseshoe Bend for the time being.

Payment Solutions for Water and Court

Esther Moreno is leading the charge to implement our new payment processing solution, Paya (The Payment Group). Services are slated to begin 3/1/2023. We plan on sending out a couple updates and marketing pushes over the next couple weeks to get all of our customers ready for the transition. We have received one credit card swiper and are ready to being taking credit card payments here at City Hall! New features will also include text payments and phone payments (even on evenings and Saturdays) as well as lower processing fees for our customers.

While we are making every effort to ensure a smooth start, we are anticipating a few bumps in road.

Development

Travel Center (CREED): We met with the new property owners of the property located at the Southernmost point of Bruceville-Eddy on their plans to turn the site into a multi-purpose facility to service trucks, RVs, as well as provide essential community services such as food service and groceries. They plan on picking up the project with earnest over the next year. This is a second proposed truck stop, not to be confused with the Ascent Travel Center or CEFCO that has previously submitted plans.

RV Park

We have a meeting scheduled next week with a developer eyeing land along I-35 for the creation of a new RV park.

Well Repair Updates



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While most of our well issues seem to be behind us, we are now experiencing problems with our distribution (booster pumps) at two locations. Last week one out of two of our distribution pumps at Tolbert well went down. I met with Johnny Grady, who was acting Public Works Director while Gene was on vacation, and the team has pulled the pump and has since sent it in for further evaluation and troubleshooting.

Friendly Oaks well was set for ramp up two weeks ago, however the flushing efforts did not quite knockout all contamination as we received a failing lab report for total coliform. This resulted in a need to continue flushing the new pipes. Samples taken on 2/13/2023 have now passed and we were in the process of starting operations back up when both of the two distribution pumps at this location failed to kick on... Gene is currently working the situation and we have both given the go ahead to purchase two new motors for this plant site to get water feeding back into the system and further stem the increased demand we have been seeing from Bluebonnet WSC.

Initial diagnosis from our electrician indicates there may have been a power surge the burned these motors up... I have a call in with Bellmead PW director to discuss the issue further. Apparently, they are having similar electrical issues with their groundwater well system stemming from electricity fluctuations and are in the process of upgrading their sites to prevent the constant swapping out of groundwater wells.

Westridge well is now back online and pumping at full capacity!

ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF THE CITY OF BRUCEVILLE-EDDY, TEXAS COMBINATION TAX AND REVENUE CERTIFICATES OF OBLIGATION, TO BE ISSUED IN A TOTAL MAXIMUM PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF \$5,861,000 FOR A NEW SANITARY SEWER SYSTEM

STATE OF TEXAS CITY OF BRUCEVILLE-EDDY

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Bruceville-Eddy, Texas (the "City"), authorized the publication of a Notice of Intention to Issue Certificates of Obligation to the effect that the City Council would meet on March 23, 2023 to adopt an Ordinance and to take such other actions which may be necessary to authorize the issuance of Combination Tax and Revenue Certificates of Obligation, in a maximum principal amount not to exceed \$5,861,000, payable from a pledge of the net revenues derived from the City's Water and Sewer System, and from City ad valorem taxes, for the purpose of construction of a new wastewater treatment and sewerage system to also include customer service facilities, land acquisition, rights-of-way, permits, professional services, and all appurtenances in connection therewith, and the costs of all professional services related thereto, all being referred to as the "Project"; and

WHEREAS, notice that such Certificates of Obligation would be approved at the meeting of March 23, 2023, was published in the manner required by law; and

WHEREAS, no petition signed by at least five percent of the qualified voters of the City was filed or presented to the City Secretary protesting the issuance of such Certificates of Obligation prior to the adoption of such Ordinance on March 23, 2023, as provided in Section 271.049 of the *Texas Local Government Code*; and

WHEREAS this City has the authority to issue Certificates of Obligation pursuant to Chapter 271 of the *Texas Local Government Code*, and has the authority to pledge revenues derived from the City's water and sewer system as provided in Chapter 1502 of the *Texas Government Code*, to the payment of City obligations, all as presently codified; and

WHEREAS, no petition signed by at least five percent of the qualified voters of the City was filed or presented to the City Secretary protesting the issuance of such Certificates of Obligation prior to the adoption of such Ordinance on March 23, 2023, as provided in Section 271.049 of the *Texas Local Government Code*; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BRUCEVILLE-EDDY, TEXAS:

Section 1. <u>RECITALS, AMOUNT AND PURPOSE OF THE CERTIFICATES</u>. The recitals set forth in the preamble hereof are incorporated herein and shall have the same force and effect as if set forth in this section. The Certificates of Obligation of the City are hereby authorized to be issued and delivered in a single series the aggregate principal

amount of \$5,861,000, for the purpose of providing funds to pay the costs of construction of the Project, and to pay costs of issuance of the Certificates.

Section 2. <u>DEFINITIONS</u>.

(a) The term "Additional Certificates" shall mean revenue bonds, certificates of obligation, or other evidences of indebtedness hereafter issued under and pursuant to the laws of the State of Texas and payable from and secured by a parity lien on and pledge of the Net Revenues of the City's waterworks and sewer system, of equal rank and dignity with the lien and pledge securing the payment of the Certificates.

(b) The terms "Certificates" or "Series 2023 Certificates" means the \$5,861,000 City of Bruceville-Eddy, Texas, Combination Tax and Revenue Certificates of Obligation, Series 2023 authorized to be issued hereunder, and includes any certificates of obligation issued in exchange or replacement therefor.

The term "Certificates" as used in this Ordinance shall mean and include collectively the Certificates initially issued and delivered pursuant to this Ordinance and all substitute Certificates exchanged therefor, as well as all other substitute Certificates and replacement Certificates issued pursuant hereto, and the term "Certificate" shall mean any of the Certificates.

(c) The term "Gross Revenues" for any period means all revenue during such period in respect or on account of the operation or ownership of the System, excluding restricted gifts, and grants in aid of construction, but including earnings and income derived from the investment or deposit of money in any special fund or account created and established from Gross Revenues.

(d) The term "Maintenance and Operating Expenses" shall mean all current expenses of operating and maintaining the System as allowed by generally accepted accounting principles applicable to the City.

(e) The term "Net Revenues" for any period means the Gross Revenues of the System less Maintenance and Operating Expenses of the System.

(f) The term "Project" shall mean construction of a new wastewater treatment and sewerage system to also include customer service facilities, land acquisition, rights-ofway, permits, and all appurtenances in connection therewith, and the cost of professional services related thereto.

(g) The term "Series" means the Series 2023 Certificates.

(h) The term "System" means the entire waterworks and sanitary sewer system of the City, together with all additions thereto (including the Project).

Section 3. <u>DESIGNATION, DATE, DENOMINATIONS, NUMBERS AND</u> <u>MATURITIES OF CERTIFICATES, REDEMPTION</u>. Each Certificate issued pursuant to this Ordinance shall be designated: "CITY OF BRUCEVILLE-EDDY, TEXAS, COMBINATION TAX AND REVENUE CERTIFICATES OF OBLIGATION, SERIES 2023, and initially there shall be issued, sold, and delivered hereunder fully registered certificates, without interest coupons, dated April 1, 2023, in the respective denominations and principal amounts hereinafter stated, numbered consecutively from R-1 upward (except the initial Certificate submitted to the Attorney General of the State of Texas which will be numbered T-1), payable to the respective initial registered owners thereof (as designated in Section 16 hereof), or to the registered assignee or assignees of the Certificates or any portion or portions thereof (in each case, the "Registered Owner"), and the Certificates shall mature and be payable annually on each April 1 in each of the years and in the principal amounts, respectively, as set forth in the following schedule:

The Certificates are subject to optional redemption, in whole or in part, in principal amounts chosen by the City, on any date chosen by the City, at the option of the City, at the par value thereof plus accrued interest, to the date of redemption. If less than all the Certificates are to be redeemed, the City may select the maturities to be redeemed. The particular maturities to be redeemed shall be in inverse order of maturity, and if less than all of a maturity is to be redeemed, the Paying Agent/Registrar shall determine by lot the Certificates, or portions thereof, within such maturity to be redeemed.

Not less than thirty (30) days prior to a redemption date for the Certificates, the City shall cause a notice of redemption to be sent by United States mail, first class, postage prepaid, to the Registered Owners of the Certificates to be redeemed, in whole or in part, at the address of each Registered Owner appearing on the registration books of the Paying Agent/Registrar at the close of business on the business day next preceding the date of mailing such notice. Redemption payments shall be made directly to the Holder by the City, and not through the Paying Agent.

The City will be responsible for the payment of interest that accrues due to Certificate redemption notification issues, whether the improper notification lies with the City or the Paying Agent.

Section 4. <u>INTEREST</u>. The Certificates scheduled to mature during the years, respectively, set forth in Section 3 shall bear interest from their date of delivery, to their respective dates of maturity or redemption prior to maturity at the following rate per annum:

The interest rate due on the Certificates shall be the lower of (i) 2.6250% per annum, or (ii) that rate of interest established by the United States of America as applicable to the Certificates on the date the first Certificate of each Series is funded.

Interest shall be payable in the manner provided and on the dates stated in the FORM OF CERTIFICATE set forth in this Ordinance.

Section 5. CHARACTERISTICS OF THE CERTIFICATES.

Registration, Transfer, Conversion and Exchange; Authentication. The City (a) shall keep or cause to be kept at The First National Bank of Moody, Moody, Texas (the "Paying Agent/Registrar"), books or records for the registration of the transfer, conversion and exchange of the Certificates (the "Registration Books"), and the City hereby appoints the Paying Agent/Registrar as its registrar and transfer agent to keep such books or records and make such registrations of transfers, conversions and exchanges under such reasonable regulations as the City and Paying Agent/Registrar may prescribe; and the Paying Agent/Registrar shall make such registrations, transfers, conversions and exchanges as herein provided within three days of presentation in due and proper form. The Paying Agent/Registrar shall obtain and record in the Registration Books the address of the Registered Owner of each Certificate to which payments with respect to the Certificates shall be mailed, as herein provided; but it shall be the duty of each Registered Owner to notify the Paying Agent/Registrar in writing of the address to which payments shall be mailed, and such interest payments shall not be mailed unless such notice has been given. The City shall have the right to inspect the Registration Books during regular business hours of the Paying Agent/Registrar, but otherwise the Paying Agent/Registrar shall keep the Registration Books confidential and, unless otherwise required by law, shall not permit their inspection by any other entity. The City shall pay the Paying Agent/Registrar's standard or customary fees and charges for making such registration, transfer, conversion, exchange and delivery of a substitute Certificate or Certificates. Registration of assignments, transfers, conversions and exchanges of Certificates shall be made in the manner provided and with the effect stated in the FORM OF CERTIFICATE set forth in this Ordinance. Each substitute Certificate shall bear a letter and/or number to distinguish it from each other Certificate. Any tax or governmental charges required to be paid with respect to any registration, exchange, or transfer of Certificates shall be paid by the person requesting such transfer.

New Certificates will be delivered by the Paying Agent/Registrar, in lieu of the Certificates being transferred or exchanged, at the designated office of the Paying Agent/Registrar, or sent by United States mail, first class, postage prepaid, to the new registered owner or his designee. To the extent possible, new Certificates issued in an exchange or transfer of Certificates will be delivered to the registered owner or assignee of the registered owner in not more than three business days after the receipt of the Certificates to be canceled, and the written instrument of transfer or request for exchange duly executed by the registered owner or his duly authorized agent, in form satisfactory to the Paying Agent/Registrar. New Certificates registered and delivered in an exchange or transfer shall be in a like aggregate principal amount as the Certificates surrendered for exchange or transfer.

Except for Certificate No. T-1 of each Series (to be authenticated by the Attorney General of Texas) hereof, an authorized representative of the Paying Agent/Registrar shall, before the delivery of any such Certificate, date and manually sign the Certificate, and no such Certificate shall be deemed to be issued or outstanding unless such Certificate is so executed. The Paying Agent/Registrar promptly shall cancel all paid Certificates and Certificates surrendered for conversion and exchange. No additional ordinances, orders, or resolutions need be passed or adopted by the governing body of the City or any other body or person so as to accomplish the foregoing conversion and exchange of any Certificate or portion thereof, and the Paying Agent/Registrar shall provide for the printing, execution, and delivery of substitute Certificates in the manner prescribed herein. Pursuant to Section 1203.021 of the Texas Government Code, the duty of conversion and exchange of Certificates as aforesaid is hereby imposed upon the Paying Agent/Registrar, and, upon the execution of the Certificate, the converted and exchanged Certificate shall be valid, incontestable, and enforceable in the same manner and with the same effect as the Certificates which initially were issued and delivered pursuant to this Ordinance, approved by the Attorney General, and registered by the Comptroller of Public Accounts.

Notwithstanding any other provision hereof, in the event of a conflict between the Paying Agent Agreement and this Ordinance, the provisions of this Ordinance shall govern.

(b) <u>Payment of Certificates and Interest</u>. The City hereby further appoints the Paying Agent/Registrar to act as the paying agent for paying the principal of and interest on the Certificates, all as provided in this Ordinance. The Paying Agent/Registrar shall keep proper records of all payments made by the City and the Paying Agent/Registrar with respect to the Certificates, and of all conversions and exchanges of Certificates, and all replacements of Certificates, as provided in this Ordinance. The record date ("Record Date") for the interest payable on the Certificates on any interest payment date means the

close of business on the last day of the preceding month. However, in the event of a nonpayment of interest on a scheduled payment date, and for thirty (30) days thereafter, a new record date for such interest payment (a "Special Record Date") will be established by the Paying Agent/Registrar, if and when funds for the payment of such interest have been received from the City. Notice of the Special Record Date and of the scheduled payment date of the past due interest (which shall be 15 days after the Special Record Date) shall be sent at least five (5) business days prior to the Special Record Date by United States mail, first-class postage prepaid, to the address of each Registered Owner appearing on the Registration Books at the close of business on the last business day next preceding the date of mailing of such notice.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, as to Certificates held by the United States of America, payment of principal and interest due on such Certificates shall be made directly to the United States of America at its designated place for payment, and not to the Paying Agent/Registrar.

In General. The Certificates (i) shall be issued in fully registered form, without (c) interest coupons, with the principal of and interest on such Certificates to be payable only to the Registered Owners thereof, (ii) may be redeemed prior to their scheduled maturities (notice of which shall be given to the Paying Agent/Registrar by the City at least 50 days prior to any such redemption date or otherwise as set forth in Section 3 hereof), (iii) may be transferred and assigned, (iv) may be converted and exchanged for other Certificates, (v) shall have the characteristics, (vi) shall be signed, sealed, executed and authenticated, (vii) the principal of and interest on the Certificates shall be payable, and (viii) shall be administered and the Paying Agent/Registrar and the City shall have certain duties and responsibilities with respect to the Certificates, all as provided, and in the manner and to the effect as required or indicated, in the FORM OF CERTIFICATE set forth in this Ordinance. The Certificates initially issued and delivered pursuant to this Ordinance (i.e., Certificate No. T-1) are not required to be, and shall not be, authenticated by the Paying Agent/Registrar, but on each substitute Certificate issued in conversion of and exchange for any Certificate or Certificates issued under this Ordinance the Paying Agent/Registrar shall execute the PAYING AGENT/REGISTRAR'S AUTHENTICATION CERTIFICATE, in the form set forth in the FORM OF CERTIFICATE.

Substitute Paying Agent/Registrar. The City covenants with the Registered (d) Owners of the Certificates that at all times while the Certificates are outstanding the City will provide a competent and legally qualified commercial bank, trust company, or other agency duly gualified and legally authorized to act as and perform the services of Paying Agent/Registrar for the Certificates under this Ordinance, and that the Paying Agent/Registrar will be one entity. The City reserves the right to, and may, at its option, change the Paying Agent/Registrar upon not less than 30 days' written notice to the Paying Agent/Registrar, to be effective at such time which will not disrupt or delay payment on the next principal or interest payment date after such notice. In the event that the entity at any time acting as Paying Agent/Registrar (or its successor by merger, acquisition, or other method) should resign or otherwise cease to act as such, the City covenants that promptly it will appoint a competent and legally qualified bank, trust company, financial institution, or other agency to act as Paying Agent/Registrar under this Ordinance. Upon any change in the Paying Agent/Registrar, the previous Paying Agent/Registrar promptly shall transfer and deliver the Registration Books (or a copy thereof), along with all other pertinent books and records relating to the Certificates, to the new Paying Agent/Registrar designated and

appointed by the City. Upon any change in the Paying Agent/Registrar, the City promptly will cause a written notice thereof to be sent by the new Paying Agent/Registrar to each Registered Owner of the Certificates, by United States mail, first-class postage prepaid, which notice also shall give the address of the new Paying Agent/Registrar. By accepting the position and performing as such, each Paying Agent/Registrar shall be deemed to have agreed to the provisions of this Ordinance, and a certified copy of this Ordinance shall be delivered to each Paying Agent/Registrar.

Section 6. FORM OF CERTIFICATES. The form of the Certificates, including the form of Paying Agent/Registrar's Authentication Certificate, the form of Assignment and the form of Registration Certificate of the Comptroller of Public Accounts of the State of Texas to be attached to the Certificates initially issued and delivered pursuant to this Ordinance, shall be, respectively, substantially as follows, with such appropriate variations, omissions, or insertions as are permitted or required by this Ordinance.

IN THE EVENT of a nonpayment of interest on a scheduled payment date, and for 30 days thereafter, a new record date for such interest payment (a "Special Record Date") will be established by the Paying Agent/Registrar, if and when funds for the payment of such interest have been received from the City. Notice of the Special Record Date and of the scheduled payment date of the past due interest (which shall be 15 days after the Special Record Date) shall be sent at least five business days prior to the Special Record Date by United States mail, first-class postage prepaid, to the address of each owner of a Certificate appearing on the Registration Books at the close of business on the last business day next preceding the date of mailing of such notice.

ANY ACCRUED INTEREST due at maturity or upon the redemption of this Certificate prior to maturity as provided herein shall be paid to the Registered Owner upon presentation and surrender of this Certificate for redemption and payment at the Designated Payment/Transfer Office of the Paying Agent/Registrar. The City covenants with the Registered Owner of this Certificate that on or before each principal payment date, interest payment date, and accrued interest payment date for this Certificate it will make available to the Paying Agent/Registrar, from the "Interest and Sinking Fund" created by the Ordinance, the amounts required to provide for the payment, in immediately available funds, of all principal of and interest on the Certificates, when due.

If less than all the Certificates are to be redeemed, the City may select the maturities to be redeemed. The particular maturities to be redeemed shall be in inverse order of maturity, and if less than all of a maturity is to be redeemed, the Paying Agent/Registrar shall determine by lot the Certificates, or portions thereof, within such maturity to be redeemed.

Not less than thirty (30) days prior to a redemption date for the Certificates, the City shall cause a notice of redemption to be sent by United States mail, first class, postage prepaid, to the Registered Owners of the Certificates to be redeemed, in whole or in part, at the address of each Registered Owner appearing on the registration books of the Paying Agent/Registrar at the close of business on the business day next preceding the date of mailing such notice.

ALL CERTIFICATES OF THIS SERIES are issuable solely as fully registered Certificates, without interest coupons. As provided in the Ordinance, this Certificate, or any unredeemed portion hereof, may, at the request of the Registered Owner or the assignee or assignees hereof, be assigned, transferred, converted into and exchanged for a like aggregate principal amount of fully registered Certificates, without interest coupons, payable to the appropriate Registered Owner, assignee or assignees, as the case may be, having the same denomination or denominations as requested in writing by the appropriate Registered Owner, assignee or assignees, as the case may be, upon surrender of this Certificate to the Paying Agent/Registrar for cancellation, all in accordance with the form and procedures set forth in the Ordinance. IT IS HEREBY certified, recited, and covenanted that this Certificate has been duly and validly authorized, issued, and delivered; that all acts, conditions, and things required or proper to be performed, exist, and be done precedent to or in the authorization, issuance, and delivery of this Certificate have been performed, existed, and been done in accordance with law; that this Certificate is a general obligation of the City, issued on the full faith and credit thereof; and that ad valorem taxes sufficient to provide for the payment of the interest on and principal of this Certificate, as such interest and principal come due, have been levied and ordered to be levied against all taxable property in the City, and have been pledged for such payment, within the limit prescribed by law, and that this Certificate is additionally secured by and payable from a pledge of the Net Revenues derived from the City's water and sewer system, and solid waste/sanitation system.

The City has reserved the right to issue additional obligations payable and secured by Net Revenues of the City's water and sewer system, either on a parity with, or subordinate to, the pledge of such Net Revenues securing the Certificates. AS TO THE PLEDGE OF WATER SYSTEM NET REVENUES, THE PLEDGE SECURING THIS CERTIFICATE IS SUBORDINATE TO THE PLEDGE OF WATER SYSTEM NET REVENUES SECURING PAYMENT OF THE CITY'S OUTSTANDING (i) WATER SYSTEM REVENUE BONDS, SERIES 2011; (ii) WATER SYSTEM REVENUE REFUNDING BONDS, SERIES 2011; (iii) WATER SYSTEM REVENUE 2013; AND (iv) SECURING PAYMENT OF THE CITY'S COMBINATION TAX AND REVENUE CERTIFICATES OF OBLIGATION, SERIES 2015.

AS TO THE PLEDGE OF SEWER SYSTEM NET REVENUES, SUCH PLEDGE IS ON A PARITY WITH THE PLEDGE OF SEWER SYSTEM REVENUES SECURING THE CITY'S COMBINATION TAX AND REVENUE CERTIFICATES OF OBLIGATION, SERIES 2015.

Section 7. INTEREST AND SINKING FUND, AND PLEDGE OF TAXES AND REVENUES.

(a) In order to secure and provide a source of payment for the Certificates, the City hereby pledges and grants to the Owners of all Certificates an irrevocable lien on ad valorem taxes collected by the City within the limitations imposed by law ("Pledged Taxes"), and a pledge of the Net Revenues derived from the City's water and solid waste sanitary sewer system (i.e., the "System"), with such Pledged Taxes and Net Revenues to secure payment of the Certificates.

The City hereby covenants and agrees that all Pledged Taxes, and such Net Revenues, shall be deposited and paid into the special funds hereinafter established, and shall be applied in the manner hereinafter set forth, in order to provide for the payment of the principal and interest on the Certificates and all expenses of paying same. The Certificates shall constitute obligations of the City that shall be payable from and shall be equally and ratably secured by an irrevocable lien on the Pledged Taxes and Net Revenues, which Pledged Taxes and Net Revenues shall, in the manner herein provided, be set aside for and pledged to the payment of the Certificates in the Interest and Sinking Fund as hereinafter provided, and the Certificates shall be in all respects on a parity with and of equal dignity with one another.

(b) Chapter 1208, *Government Code* applies to the issuance of the Certificates and the pledge of the Net Revenues and Pledged Taxes granted by the City hereunder, and such pledge, therefore, is valid, effective, and perfected. If Texas law is amended at any time while the Certificates are Outstanding and unpaid such that the pledge of Net Revenues and Pledged Taxes granted by the City hereunder is to be subject to the filing requirements of Chapter 9, *Business and Commerce Code*, then in order to preserve to the Registered Owner the perfection of the security interest in such pledge, the City agrees to take such measures as it determines are reasonable and necessary under Texas law to comply with the applicable provisions of Chapter 9, *Business and Commerce Code* and enable a filing to perfect the security interest in such pledge to occur.

(c) A special Interest and Sinking Fund (the "Interest and Sinking Fund") is hereby created solely for the benefit of the Certificates, and the Interest and Sinking Fund shall be established and maintained by the City at an official depository bank of the City. The Interest and Sinking Fund shall be kept separate and apart from all other funds and accounts of the City, and shall be used only for paying the interest on and principal of the Certificates. All ad valorem taxes levied and collected for an on account of the Certificates shall be deposited, as collected, to the credit of the Interest and Sinking Fund. During each year while any of the Certificates or interest thereon are outstanding and unpaid, the governing body of the City shall compute and ascertain a rate and amount of ad valorem tax which will be sufficient to raise and produce the money required to pay the interest on the Certificates as such interest comes due during each calendar year, and to provide and maintain a sinking fund adequate to pay the principal of its Certificates as such principal matures (but never less than two percent (2%) of the original principal amount of the Certificates as a sinking fund each year); and said tax shall be based on the latest approved tax rolls of the City, with full allowance being made for tax delinquencies and the cost of tax collection. Said rate and amount of ad valorem tax is hereby levied, and is hereby ordered to be levied, against all taxable property in the City for each year while any of the Certificates or interest thereon are outstanding and unpaid; and said tax shall be assessed and collected each such year and deposited to the credit of the aforesaid Interest and Sinking Fund. Said ad valorem taxes sufficient to provide for the payment of the interest on and principal of the Certificates, as such interest comes due and such principal matures, are hereby pledged for such payment, within the limit prescribed by law.

(d) The Certificates are additionally secured by a pledge of the Net Revenues of the System. The pledge of such Net Revenues of the City's water system is subordinate to the pledge of Net Revenues securing payment of the City's (i) Water System Revenue Bonds, Series 2011; (ii) Water System Revenue Refunding Bonds, Series 2011; (iii) Water System Revenue Bonds, Series 2013; and (iv) the City's Combination Tax and Revenue Certificates of Obligation, Series 2015.

The pledge of sewer system revenues is on a first lien parity with the pledge of sewer system revenues securing the City's Combination Tax and Revenue Certificates of Obligation, Series 2015.

The City shall deposit Net Revenues to the credit of the Interest and Sinking Fund created pursuant to Section 7(c), to the extent determined by the City. Notwithstanding the requirements of Section 7(c), if such Net Revenues are actually on deposit for deposit in the Interest and Sinking Fund in advance of the time when ad valorem taxes are scheduled to be levied for any fiscal year, then the amount of taxes which otherwise would have been required to be levied pursuant to Section 7(c) may be reduced to the extent and by the amount of the Net Revenues then on deposit in the Interest and Sinking Fund or budgeted for deposit therein.

For so long as any Certificates remain outstanding during each fiscal year of the City, there shall be transferred into the Interest and Sinking Fund from Net Revenues of the System, or from ad valorem taxes collected by the City, such amounts as will be sufficient to pay (a) the interest scheduled to become due on the Certificates on the immediately next two following semiannual interest payment dates, and (b) the greater of (i) two percent (2%) of the principal amount of the then outstanding Certificates or (ii) the principal scheduled to become due on the Certificates or (a) the principal payment date.

(e) Money in the Interest and Sinking Fund and the Construction Fund may, at the option of the City, be invested in time deposits or certificates of deposit secured in the

manner required by law for public funds, or be invested in direct obligations of the United States of America or any of its agencies or in any other obligations permitted by law; provided that all such deposits and investments shall be made in such manner that the money required to be expended from any Fund will be available at the proper time or times. Any obligation in which money is so invested shall be kept and held by the official depository bank of the City at which the Fund is maintained from which the investment was made. All such investments shall be promptly sold when necessary to prevent any default in connection with the Certificates.

(f) Notwithstanding any other provisions hereof, payment of the principal and interest due on the Certificates shall be made by wire transfer.

Section 8. <u>SYSTEM FUND</u>. The City hereby covenants and agrees that, while the Certificates remain Outstanding, all revenues derived from the operation of the System shall be kept separate and apart from all other funds and moneys of the City, and such revenues shall be deposited from day to day as collected into a fund or funds maintained at an official depository of the City known as the "City of Bruceville-Eddy Waterworks and Sewer System Fund" (together hereinafter called the "System Fund"). All moneys deposited in the System Fund shall be pledged and appropriated to the extent required for the following purposes and in the order of priority shown, to wit:

<u>First</u>: To the payment of all necessary and reasonable Maintenance and Operating Expenses of the System as defined herein or required by statute to be a first charge on and claim against the revenues thereof.

<u>Second</u>: As to water system revenues, to the payment of the principal and interest on the City's (i) Water System Revenue Bonds, Series 2011; (ii) Water System Revenue Refunding Bonds, Series 2011; (iii) Water System Revenue Bonds, Series 2013; and (iv) Combination Tax and Revenue Certificates of Obligation, Series 2015, and any reserve funds established in connection therewith, or any further parity indebtedness expressly issued on a parity with such obligations, as the same become due.

As to the Sewer System Revenues, to the payment of principal and interest on the Certificates and the City's Combination Tax and Revenue Certificates of Obligation, Series 2015, and any reserve funds established in connection therewith.

<u>Third</u>: Any Net Revenues remaining in the System Fund after satisfying the foregoing payments, or making adequate and sufficient provision for the payment thereof, may be appropriated and used for prepayment of any subordinate lien indebtedness, or for improvements to the System, or any other purpose allowed by law.

Reference is made to Section 11 below as to additional indebtedness, which may, at the option of the City, be issued on parity with the pledge of Net Revenues securing the Certificates.

Section 9. (deleted)

Section 10. <u>SECURITY OF FUNDS</u>. All moneys on deposit in the Funds for which this Ordinance makes provision (except any portion thereof as may be at any time properly invested) shall be secured or collateralized in the manner and to the fullest extent required

by the laws of Texas for the security of public funds, and moneys on deposit in such Funds shall be used only for the purposes permitted by this Ordinance.

Section 11. <u>ISSUANCE OF ADDITIONAL INDEBTEDNESS</u>. That (in addition to the right to issue junior lien Certificates of Obligation or other subordinate lien obligations secured by Net Revenues of the System, as authorized by the laws of the State of Texas), the City, in order to provide for improvements, extensions, enlargements and repairs to the System, reserves the right to issue additional certificates of obligation, revenue bonds, or other evidence of indebtedness ("Additional Bonds"), payable from and secured by a pledge of the Net Revenues of the System on a parity with the pledge of Net Revenues securing the Certificates. When issued in compliance with the law and terms and conditions hereinafter appearing, the lien or pledge securing such Additional Bonds shall occupy a position of parity and equal dignity with the lien or pledge securing the Certificates. The Additional Bonds, which the City reserves the right to issue, may be issued provided that the following conditions shall have been met:

(a) That the laws of the State of Texas in force at such time provide for the issuance of such Additional Bonds.

(b) The City is not in default as to any covenant, condition or obligation prescribed by this Ordinance, and the INTEREST AND SINKING FUND contains the amount of money then required to be on deposit therein, as certified by the Mayor and City Secretary.

(c) The City has secured from a Certified Public Accountant or registered professional engineer and provided to the United States of America (or other holder of the Certificates) a certificate showing that the anticipated Net Revenues for the completed fiscal year next following the year in which such Additional Bonds are to be issued, is equal to at least 1.20 times the average annual debt service requirements (calculated on a fiscal year basis) of all Certificates (and other indebtedness payable from or secured by a lien against Net Revenues) secured in whole or in part by Net Revenues then outstanding and including those Additional Bonds used to complete the Project, and provided further this requirement may be waived or modified by the written consent of the holders of seventy-five percent (75%) of the Certificates then outstanding, determined by outstanding principal amount.

(d) Provision is made in the ordinance authorizing the Additional Bonds or other indebtedness then proposed to be issued for additional payments to be made into the INTEREST AND SINKING FUND sufficient to provide for any increased principal of and interest requirements resulting from the issuance of the Additional Bonds or other indebt-edness.

(e) The United States of America, if it remains a holder of the Certificates, agrees to the issuance of such additional parity debt.

(f) So long as the United States of America holds any Certificates, the City will not issue any obligations without the prior written consent of the United States of America, except as otherwise provided by applicable law.

The City will not issue any certificates of obligation, bonds, notes, or other obligations secured in whole or in part by liens on the Net Revenues that are junior and subordinate to the lien on Net Revenues securing payment of the Certificates without the prior written consent of the United States of America, except as otherwise provided by applicable law.

Section 12. <u>SHORT-LIVED ASSET REPLACEMENT RESERVE</u>. The City shall deposit into a short-lived asset replacement fund the amount of \$26,133 per year for each year any of the Certificates remain outstanding and unpaid.. Such fund shall be used solely to make repairs to the System, and if any amount is withdrawn from such fund the City shall promptly replace the same.

Section 13. <u>DAMAGED, MUTILATED, LOST, STOLEN, OR DESTROYED</u> <u>CERTIFICATES</u>.

(a) <u>Replacement Certificates</u>. In the event any outstanding Certificate is damaged, mutilated, lost, stolen, or destroyed, the Paying Agent/Registrar shall cause to be printed, executed, and delivered, a new Certificate of the same principal amount, maturity, and interest rate, as the damaged, mutilated, lost, stolen, or destroyed Certificate, in replacement for such Certificate in the manner hereinafter provided.

(b) <u>Application for Replacement Certificates</u>. Application for replacement of damaged, mutilated, lost, stolen, or destroyed Certificates shall be made by the Registered Owner thereof to the Paying Agent/Registrar. In every case of loss, theft, or destruction of a Certificate, the Registered Owner applying for a replacement Certificate shall furnish to the City and to the Paying Agent/Registrar such security or indemnity as may be required by them to save each of them harmless from any loss or damage with respect thereto. Also, in every case of loss, theft, or destruction of a Certificate, the Registered Owner shall furnish to the City and to the Paying Agent/Registrar evidence to their satisfaction of the loss, theft, or destruction of such Certificate, as the case may be. In every case of damage or mutilation of a Certificate, the Registered Owner shall surrender to the Paying Agent/Registrar for cancellation the Certificate so damaged or mutilated.

(c) <u>No Default Occurred</u>. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Section, in the event any such Certificate shall have matured, and no default has occurred which is then continuing in the payment of the principal of, redemption premium, if any, or interest on the Certificate, the City may authorize the payment of the same (without surrender thereof except in the case of a damaged or mutilated Certificate) instead of issuing a replacement Certificate, provided security or indemnity is furnished as above provided in this Section.

(d) <u>Charge for Issuing Replacement Certificates</u>. Prior to the issuance of any replacement Certificate, the Paying Agent/Registrar shall charge the Registered Owner of such Certificate with all legal, printing, and other expenses in connection therewith. Every replacement Certificate issued pursuant to the provisions of this Section by virtue of the fact that any Certificate is lost, stolen, or destroyed shall constitute a contractual obligation of the City whether or not the lost, stolen, or destroyed Certificate shall be found at any time, or be enforceable by anyone, and shall be entitled to all the benefits of this Ordinance equally and proportionately with any and all other Certificates duly issued under this Ordinance.

(e) <u>Authority for Issuing Replacement Certificates</u>. In accordance with Section 1201.061(a)(2), *Texas Government Code*, as amended and presently codified, this Section 13 of this Ordinance shall constitute authority for the issuance of any such replacement Certificate without necessity of further action by the governing body of the City or any other body or person, and the duty of the replacement of such Certificates is hereby authorized and imposed upon the Paying Agent/Registrar, and the Paying Agent/Registrar shall authenticate and deliver such Certificates in the form and manner and with the effect, as provided in Section 5(a) of this Ordinance for Certificates issued in conversion and exchange for other Certificates.

(f) <u>Certificates held by the United States of America</u>. In the event any Certificate is mutilated, destroyed, lost or stolen, any security or indemnity as may be required by the City and/or the Paying Agent/Registrar from the registered owner applying for the replacement Certificate shall not be required from the United States of America as long as it is holder of the Certificates.

Section 14. <u>CUSTODY, APPROVAL, AND REGISTRATION OF CERTIFICATES;</u> <u>BOND COUNSEL'S OPINION</u>. The City Manager of the City is hereby authorized to have control of the Certificates initially issued and delivered hereunder and all necessary records and proceedings pertaining to the Certificates pending their delivery and their investigation, examination, and approval by the Attorney General of the State of Texas, and their registration by the Comptroller of Public Accounts of the State of Texas. Upon registration of the Certificates the Comptroller of Public Accounts (or a deputy designated in writing to act for the Comptroller) shall manually sign the Comptroller's Registration Certificate attached to such Certificates, and the seal of the Comptroller shall be impressed, or placed in facsimile, on such Certificate. The Certificates shall not have or bear CUSIP numbers.

Section 15. [deleted]

Section 16. <u>SALE OF CERTIFICATES</u>. The Certificates are hereby sold and shall be delivered to the United States of America (sometimes referred to herein as the "Purchaser"), at the price of par, with interest to accrue from the date of delivery of each draw. It is hereby officially found, determined, and declared that the terms of this sale are the most advantageous reasonably obtainable. The initial Certificates shall be registered in the name of the United States of America.

Section 17. <u>PROCEEDS OF SALE</u>. The proceeds of sale of the Certificates shall be deposited through a series of draws into a Series 2023 Certificates of Obligation construction fund (the "Construction Fund") maintained at The First National Bank of Moody, Moody, Texas. Moneys may be withdrawn from the Construction Fund solely to pay for costs of the Project, and for payment of costs of issuance for the Certificates. Pending expenditure for authorized projects and purposes, such proceeds of sale may be invested authorized investments in accordance with the Public Funds Investment Act (V.T.C.A., *Government Code*, Chapter 2256), and any investment earnings realized may be expended for such authorized projects and purposes or deposited in the Interest and Sinking Fund as shall be determined by the City Council. Accrued interest and premium, if any, received from the Purchasers as well as all surplus proceeds of sale of the Certificates, including investment earnings, remaining after the accomplishment of all

authorized projects and purposes shall promptly be deposited to the credit of the Interest and Sinking Fund.

The Certificates are to be funded in a series of draws in a maximum aggregate principal amount of \$5,861,000 (representing the aggregate principal amount of the Certificates). The City, or its authorized representative, shall submit each draw request to the United States of America, United States Department of Agriculture ("USDA"). No draw shall be funded until approved by the USDA. Each draw shall bear interest from the date of such draw, as shown on the books of record kept by the holder of the Certificates. The USDA shall also approve the Project budget and all amendments thereto. All draws shall be deposited into the Construction Fund as established pursuant to this Section 17.

Section 18. <u>APPROVAL OF PAYING AGENT/REGISTRAR AGREEMENT</u>. The Paying Agent/Registrar Agreement with The First National Bank of Moody is hereby approved. The Mayor is hereby authorized to amend, complete or modify such agreement as necessary and is further authorized to execute such agreement and the City Secretary is hereby authorized to attest such agreement.

The City, The First National Bank of Moody, and the USDA shall enter into an Escrow Agreement governing how each draw shall be made, which such Escrow Agreement is hereby approved.

Section 19. [deleted]

Section 20. <u>**RECORDS AND ACCOUNTS - ANNUAL AUDIT**</u>. The City further covenants and agrees that so long as any of the Certificates remain Outstanding, it will keep and maintain accurate and complete records and accounts pertaining to the operations of the City in which complete and correct entries shall be made of all transactions relating thereto, as provided by applicable law. The City further agrees that following the close of each Fiscal Year, it will cause an audit of such books and accounts to be made by an independent firm of Certified Public Accountants.

The City shall furnish to the USDA and the holder of the Certificates a copy of its annual audit, within one hundred and eighty (180) days after completion thereof, and such other financial reports as the holder of the Certificates or the USDA may request.

Section 21. [deleted]

Section 22. <u>SEVERABILITY</u>. The provisions of this Ordinance are severable; and in case any one or more of the provisions of this Ordinance or the application thereof to any person or circumstance should be held to be invalid, unconstitutional, or ineffective as to any person or circumstance, the remainder of this Ordinance nevertheless shall be valid, and the application of any such invalid provision to persons or circumstances other than those as to which it is held invalid shall not be affected thereby.

Section 23. <u>AMENDMENTS.</u> The City may amend this Ordinance without the consent of or notice to any registered owners in any manner not detrimental to the interests of the registered owners, including the curing of any ambiguity, inconsistency, or formal defect or omission therein. In addition, the City may, with the written consent of the holders of a majority in aggregate principal amount of the Certificates then outstanding affected

thereby, amend, add to, or rescind any of the provisions of the Ordinance; except that, without the consent of the registered owners of all of the Certificates affected, no such amendment, addition, or rescission may (1) change the date specified as the date on which the principal of or any installment of interest on any Certificate is due and payable, reduce the principal amount thereof, or the rate of interest thereon, change the place or places at or the coin or currency in which any Certificate or interest thereon is payable, or in any other way modify the terms of payment of the principal of or interest on the Certificates, (2) give any preference to any Certificate over any other Certificate, or (3) reduce the aggregate principal amount of Certificates required for consent to any amendment, addition, or waiver.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, so long as the United States of America is a holder of any of the Certificates, the City shall send the United States of America notice of such amendment(s); and no such amendment(s) to this Ordinance or the Certificates shall be made without the prior written consent of the United States of America.

Section 24. <u>EVENTS OF DEFAULT</u>. The following shall constitute an Event of Default hereunder:

(a) The failure by the City to make payment of principal of or interest on the Certificates as the same become due.

(b) Default by the City in the observance or performance of any of the other covenants, conditions or obligations of the City hereunder, the failure to perform which materially adversely affects the rights of the holders, including but not limited to, their prospect or ability to be repaid in accordance with this Ordinance, and the continuation thereof for a period of 60 days after notice of such default is given by any owner to the City.

Upon and following any event of default, any Registered Owner is entitled to seek a writ of mandamus from a court of proper jurisdiction requiring that the City comply with its obligations under this Ordinance. The rights of the Registered Owners hereunder do not include the right to compel acceleration of the maturity of the Certificates but only to require payment of the Certificates as the same are then due as of the date of such mandamus.

Section 25. <u>FURTHER ASSURANCES</u>. The Mayor, City Secretary and other City officials are hereby authorized to execute and deliver such further agreements and documents as are necessary to carry out the intents and purposes of this Ordinance.

Section 26. ORDINANCE TO CONSTITUTE A CONTRACT. This Ordinance shall constitute a contract between the City and the holders of the Certificates.

Section 27. [deleted]

Section 28: LOAN PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS AND DOCUMENTS TO CONTROL.

Section 28.01. Definitions.

For the purposes of this Section, the following acronyms and terms shall be defined as follows:

(a) RUS: The Rural Utilities Service, an agency of the United States of America within the United States Department of Agriculture, and any successor agency thereof.

(b) Loan: The loan in the aggregate principal amount of \$5,861,000 from the purchaser to the City, which has been authorized under 7 U.S.C. § 1926, and which is represented by the purchaser's purchase of the City's \$5,861,000 Combination Tax and Revenue Certificates of Obligation, Series 2023.

(c) Agency rules: The statutes, rules, regulations and policies of the RUS, in effect on the date hereof, which pertain to or which are applicable to the loan and such future statutes, rules, regulations and policies which are not inconsistent with the express provisions hereof.

(d) Loan document provisions: The terms, conditions, requirements and provisions of the loan instruments and loan documents, including but not limited to, loan resolutions, security agreements, assurance agreements, certifications, and equal opportunity agreements, which were signed by the City for the benefit of the United States of America and/or of the RUS, and for the purpose of obtaining the loan.

Section 28.02. Compliance with Agency Rules.

(a) To the extent permitted by State law and if such law is not otherwise preempted by federal statute, regulation or rule, the City shall comply with all agency rules and loan document provisions.

(b) Notwithstanding any other term, condition, requirement or provision contained in this Ordinance, the agency rules and loan document provisions shall, to the extent permitted by State law and if such law is not otherwise preempted by federal statute, regulation or rule, control to the extent of any conflict between the Ordinance and such agency rules or such loan document provisions.

Section 28.03. Interest Accrual.

Notwithstanding any other term, condition, requirement or provision contained in this Ordinance to the contrary, interest on a Certificate shall continue to accrue and be payable to the United States of America so long as the Certificate remains unpaid and outstanding. Interest will not cease to accrue for any reason (including the establishment of a redemption date or prepayment date) until the date when payment in full has been received at the agency office designated to receive payments. For the purpose of determining "the date when payment in full has been received at the agency office designated to receive payments," such date shall be:

> 1. when payment is made by hand delivery, the date when such payment has been physically delivered into the possession of such agency at the address given to the Issuer;

> 2. when payment is made by first class mail, the third day following Issuer's mailing of the payment, postage prepaid, using the U.S. Postal Service and Issuer's receipt of written proof of the mailing from the U.S. Postal Service identifying the date of mailing;

3. when payment is made by overnight delivery, the first day following Issuer's sending of the payment, using the U.S. Postal Service or another delivery service, such as Federal Express, and Issuer's receipt of written proof of sending from the delivery service identifying the date of sending;

4. when payment is made by electronic transfer of funds, the date that the electronic transfer of funds for the payment is completed; or

5. when payment is made by preauthorized electronic debit or draft, the date that the electronic debit or draft for the payment is paid.

Section 28.04. Redemption or Prepayment.

Notwithstanding any other term, condition, requirement or provision contained in this Ordinance, redemption or prepayment of a Certificate may occur without presentation or presentment of the Certificate.

Section 28.05. Direct Payment.

Notwithstanding any other term, condition, requirement or provision contained in the Ordinance or in the Certificate to the contrary, all payments shall be made by the City directly to the agency office designated to receive payments.

Section 28.06. No Presentment or Surrender.

Notwithstanding any other term, condition, requirement or provision contained in this Ordinance to the contrary, all payments (including payments at maturity or at redemption or prepayment of a Certificate) may occur without surrender, presentation or presentment of the Certificates.

Section 28.07. Replacement Certificates.

Notwithstanding any other term, condition, requirement or provision contained in this Ordinance to the contrary, and in the event that a Certificate is lost, stolen, damaged, mutilated, or destroyed, the United States of America will not be required to obtain a replacement Certificate in order to continue to receive timely payments under such Certificate and will not be required to provide security or indemnity as a condition to receiving timely payments under such Certificate.

Section 28.08. Limitation on Application of this Section.

(a) The provisions of this section shall be operative only for so long as any of the Certificates issued under this Ordinance are owned or held by: (1) the United States of America; or (2) any agency thereof.

(b) The provisions of this section shall not be used to or shall not be construed so as to allow the Ordinance to violate any applicable provision of Texas law to the extent that such law is not otherwise preempted by applicable federal statute, regulation or rule.

The payment of interest on this Certificate shall be made by the Paying Agent/Registrar to the Registered Owner hereof on each interest payment date by check or draft, dated as of such interest payment date, drawn by the Paying Agent/Registrar on, and payable solely from, funds of the City required by the Ordinance authorizing the issuance of this Certificate (the "Ordinance") to be on deposit with the Paying Agent/Registrar for such purpose as hereinafter provided; and such check or draft shall be sent by the Paying Agent/Registrar by United States mail, first-class postage prepaid, on each such interest payment date, to the Registered Owner hereof, at its address as it appeared on the last business day of the month next preceding each such date (the "Record Date") on the Registration Books kept by the Paying Agent/Registrar, as hereinafter described. In addition, interest may be paid

by such other method, acceptable to the Paying Agent/Registrar, requested by, and at the risk and expense of, the Registered Owner.

IN THE EVENT of a nonpayment of interest on a scheduled payment date, and for 30 days thereafter, a new record date for such interest payment (a "Special Record Date") will be established by the Paying Agent/Registrar, if and when funds for the payment of such interest have been received from the City. Notice of the Special Record Date and of the scheduled payment date of the past due interest (which shall be 15 days after the Special Record Date) shall be sent at least five business days prior to the Special Record Date by United States mail, first-class postage prepaid, to the address of each owner of a Certificate appearing on the Registration Books at the close of business on the last business day next preceding the date of mailing of such notice.

ANY ACCRUED INTEREST due at maturity or upon the redemption of this Certificate prior to maturity as provided herein shall be paid to the Registered Owner upon presentation and surrender of this Certificate for redemption and payment at the Designated Payment/Transfer Office of the Paying Agent/Registrar. The City covenants with the Registered Owner of this Certificate that on or before each principal payment date, interest payment date, and accrued interest payment date for this Certificate it will make available to the Paying Agent/Registrar, from the "Interest and Sinking Fund" created by the Ordinance, the amounts required to provide for the payment, in immediately available funds, of all principal of and interest on the Certificates, when due.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, as to any Certificate held by the United States of America, all payments of principal and interest due on such Certificates shall be made directly to the United States of America at their designated place for payment.

IF THE DATE for the payment of the principal of or interest on this Certificate shall be a Saturday, Sunday, a legal holiday, or a day on which banking institutions in the City where the principal corporate trust office of the Paying Agent/Registrar is located are authorized by law or executive Ordinance to close, then the date for such payment shall be the next succeeding day which is not such a Saturday, Sunday, legal holiday, or day on which banking institutions are authorized to close; and payment on such date shall have the same force and effect as if made on the original date payment was due.

THIS CERTIFICATE is one of a series of Certificates dated April 1, 2023, authorized in accordance with the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas in the principal amount of \$5,861,000 FOR ALL OR ANY PART OF THE COST OF CONSTRUCTION OF A NEW WASTEWATER TREATMENT AND SEWERAGE SYSTEM TO ALSO INCLUDE CUSTOMER SERVICE FACILITIES, LAND ACQUISITION, RIGHTS-OF-WAY, PERMITS, AND ALL APPURTENANCES IN CONNECTION THEREWITH,, AND THE COSTS OF ALL PROFESSIONAL SERVICES RELATED THERETO.

This Certificate is subject to optional redemption, in whole or in part, in principal amounts chosen by the City, on any date chosen by the City, at the option of the City, at the par value thereof plus accrued interest, to the date of redemption. If less than all the Certificates are to be redeemed, the City may select the maturities to be redeemed. The particular maturities to be redeemed shall be in inverse order of maturity, and if less than all of a maturity is to be redeemed, the Paying Agent/Registrar shall determine by lot the Certificates, or portions thereof, within such maturity to be redeemed.

Not less than thirty (30) days prior to a redemption date for the Certificates, the City shall cause a notice of redemption to be sent by United States mail, first class, postage prepaid, to the Registered Owners of the Certificates to be redeemed, in whole or in part, at the address of each Registered Owner appearing on the registration books of the Paying Agent/Registrar at the close of business on the business day next preceding the date of mailing such notice.

ALL CERTIFICATES OF THIS SERIES are issuable solely as fully registered Certificates, without interest coupons. As provided in the Ordinance, this Certificate, or any unredeemed portion hereof, may, at the request of the Registered Owner or the assignee or assignees hereof, be assigned, transferred, converted into and exchanged for a like aggregate principal amount of fully registered Certificates, without interest coupons, payable to the appropriate Registered Owner, assignee or assignees, as the case may be, having the same denomination or denominations as requested in writing by the appropriate Registered Owner, assignee or assignees, as the case may be, upon surrender of this Certificate to the Paying Agent/Registrar for cancellation, all in accordance with the form and procedures set forth in the Ordinance. Among other requirements for such assignment and transfer, this Certificate must be presented and surrendered to the Paying Agent/Registrar, together with proper instruments of assignment, in form and with guarantee of signatures satisfactory to the Paying Agent/Registrar, evidencing assignment of this Certificate or any portion or portions hereof to the assignee or assignees in whose name or names this Certificate or any such portion or portions hereof is or are to be registered. The form of Assignment printed or endorsed on this Certificate may be executed by the Registered Owner to evidence the assignment hereof, but such method is not exclusive, and other instruments of assignment satisfactory to the Paying Agent/Registrar may be used to evidence the assignment of this Certificate or any portion or portions hereof from time to time by the Registered Owner. The Paving Agent/Registrar's reasonable standard or customary fees and charges for assigning, transferring, converting and exchanging any Certificate or portion thereof will be paid by the City. In any circumstance, any taxes or governmental charges required to be paid with respect thereto shall be paid by the one requesting such assignment, transfer, conversion or exchange, as a condition precedent to the exercise of such privilege. The Paying Agent/Registrar shall not be required to make any such transfer, conversion, or exchange (i) during the period commencing on the close of business on any Record Date and ending with the opening of business on the next following principal or interest payment date or (ii) with respect to any Certificate or any portion thereof called for redemption prior to maturity, within 45 days prior to its redemption date; provided, however, such limitation of transfer shall not be applicable to an exchange by the Registered Owner of the unredeemed balance of the Certificate.

IN THE EVENT any Paying Agent/Registrar for the Certificates is changed by the City, resigns, or otherwise ceases to act as such, the City has covenanted in the Ordinance that it promptly will appoint a competent and legally qualified substitute therefor, and cause written notice thereof to be mailed to the Registered Owners of the Certificates.

IT IS HEREBY certified, recited, and covenanted that this Certificate has been duly and validly authorized, issued, and delivered; that all acts, conditions, and things required or proper to be performed, exist, and be done precedent to or in the authorization, issuance, and delivery of this Certificate have been performed, existed, and been done in accordance with law; that this Certificate is a general obligation of the City, issued on the full faith and credit thereof; and that ad valorem taxes sufficient to provide for the payment of the interest on and principal of this Certificate, as such interest and principal come due, have been levied and ordered to be levied against all taxable property in the City, and have been pledged for such payment, within the limit prescribed by law, and that this Certificate is additionally secured by and payable from a pledge of the Net Revenues derived from the City's water and sewer system and sanitation system.

The City has reserved the right to issue additional obligations payable and secured by Net Revenues of the City's water and sewer system, either on a parity with, or subordinate to, the pledge of such Net Revenues securing the Certificates. AS TO THE PLEDGE OF WATER SYSTEM NET REVENUES, THE PLEDGE SECURING THIS CERTIFICATE IS SUBORDINATE TO THE PLEDGE OF WATER SYSTEM NET REVENUES SECURING PAYMENT OF THE CITY'S (i) WATER SYSTEM REVENUE BONDS, SERIES 2011; (ii) WATER SYSTEM REVENUE REFUNDING BONDS, SERIES 2011; (iii) WATER SYSTEM REVENUE BONDS, SERIES 2013; AND (iv) SECURING PAYMENT OF THE CITY'S COMBINATION TAX AND REVENUE CERTIFICATES OF OBLIGATION, SERIES 2015.

AS TO THE PLEDGE OF SEWER SYSTEM NET REVENUES, SUCH PLEDGE IS ON A PARITY WITH THE PLEDGE OF SEWER SYSTEM REVENUES SECURING THE CITY'S COMBINATION TAX AND REVENUE CERTIFICATES OF OBLIGATION, SERIES 2015.

BY BECOMING the Registered Owner of this Certificate, the Registered Owner thereby acknowledges all of the terms and provisions of the Ordinance, agrees to be bound by such terms and provisions, acknowledges that the Ordinance is duly recorded and available for inspection in the official minutes and records of the governing body of the City, and agrees that the terms and provisions of this Certificate and the Ordinance constitute a contract between each Registered Owner hereof and the City.

ORDINANCE NO. 3-23-2023-3

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF BRUCEVILLE-EDDY, TEXAS AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF BRUCEVILLE-EDDY, TEXAS, CHAPTER 1: "GENERAL PROVISIONS" BY ADDING A NEW ARTICLE 1.09, "SOCIAL MEDIA AND TECHNOLOGY USE POLICY," THEREBY ESTABLISHING RULES FOR EMPLOYEES, ELECTED OFFICIALS, AND APPOINTED OFFICIALS; PROVIDING DEFINITIONS, CONDUCT STANDARDS, AND CONSEQUENCES FOR MISUSE; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City of Bruceville-Eddy ("City"), located in McLennan and Falls Counties, Texas, is a Type-A, general law municipality authorized under Texas state law to legislate in the best interests of its residents; and

WHEREAS, Section 51.001 of the Texas Local Government Code provides, in part, that the City "may adopt . . . an ordinance, rule or police regulation that is for the good government, peace, or order of the municipality . . . and is necessary or proper for carrying out a power granted by law to the municipality"; and

WHEREAS, Section 51.012 of the Texas Local Government Code provides, in part, that a municipality may adopt an ordinance "that is necessary for the government, interest, welfare, or good order of the municipality as a body politic"; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Bruceville-Eddy, Texas ("City Council"), the City deems it necessary to issuances professional and personal conduct standards for the use of social media for both employees as well as elected and appointed officials; and

WHEREAS, the City deems it necessary to adopt such rules for the safeguarding of access to and the use of City owned information technology systems to include devices accessing networks on personally owned devices;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BRUCEVILLE-EDDY, TEXAS, THAT:

SECTION 1. All of the above premises are found to be true and correct legislative determinations of the City Council and they are hereby incorporated into the body of this Ordinance as if copied and set forth herein in their entirety.

SECTION 2. The Code of Ordinances of the City of Bruceville-Eddy, Texas, Chapter 1: "General Provisions," is hereby amended by adding a new Article 1.09, "social media and technology use policy," which shall read in its entirety from the date of passage as follows:

ARTICLE 1.09, SOCIAL MEDIA AND TECHNOLOGY USE POLICY

Sec. 1.09.001 Definitions

For the purposes of this policy, unless otherwise stated, the following definitions apply:

<u>Comment</u> – a message posted by site visitors, either in response to an existing topic or introducing a new topic. In general, the user solely controls the content of comments, but often can be deleted, accepted or rejected prior to publishing by the site.

<u>Connections</u> – Any deliberate links between a user and a social media channel or page, whether it is initiated by the individual or by the site moderator. Terms used by various sites to describe a connection include friend, fan, follower, or subscriber.

<u>Limited forum</u> – a public forum created by the government voluntarily for expressive activity that may be restricted as to subject matter or class of speaker. Forum restrictions must be able to withstand strict judicial scrutiny of its effect on First Amendment rights.

<u>Post</u> – In relation to social media accounts or online activity, anything published in an online forum or social media account.

<u>Social media</u> – Internet based third-party platforms that facilitate interaction and engagement among individuals in a network or virtual community. Social media often offers a participatory environment and includes user-generated content such as videos, photos, videos, blogs, and wikis.

<u>Professional social media accounts</u> - those accounts which are used for the promotion and exchange of information in a person's occupational capacity and or which are primarily associated with a job, business or enterprise.

<u>Information Technology (IT)</u> – The Department of the City of Bruceville-Eddy, or its' designated contractor, charged with the installation, maintainance, and protection of the information technology system and any of its' components.

1.09.002 Purpose of Technology Use Policy

The City of Bruceville-Eddy recognizes that use of the internet and e-mail has many benefits and can make workplace communication more efficient and effective. Therefore, employees and elected and appointed officials (hereafter referred to collectively as "officials") are encouraged to use the internet and e-mail systems appropriately. Unacceptable use of the internet and e-mail can place the City of Bruceville-Eddy and others at risk. This policy outlines the City's guidelines for acceptable use of the internet and e-mail.

1.09.003 Technology Use in General

This policy must be followed in conjunction with other City of Bruceville-Eddy policies governing appropriate workplace conduct and behavior. City of Bruceville-Eddy complies with all applicable federal, state and local laws as they concern the employer/employee relationship, and nothing contained herein should be construed to violate any of the rights or responsibilities contained in such laws.

The City of Bruceville-Eddy has established the following guidelines for employees, elected officials, and appointed officials use of the Company's technology and communication networks, including the internet and e-mail, in an appropriate, ethical, and professional manner.

- a. All technology provided by the City of Bruceville-Eddy, including computer systems, communication networks, company-related work records and other information stored electronically, is the property of the City of Bruceville-Eddy and not the employee or official. In general, use of the City's technology systems and electronic communication should be job-related and not for personal convenience.
- b. Employees and officials may not use the City of Bruceville-Eddy's internet, e-mail, or other electronic communications to transmit, retrieve or store any communications or other content of a defamatory, discriminatory, harassing or pornographic nature. No messages with derogatory or inflammatory remarks about an individual's race, age, disability, religion, national origin, or physical attributes may be transmitted. Harassment using a City network or device is prohibited.
- c. Transmission of disparaging, abusive, profane, or offensive language; materials which might be contrary to City of Bruceville-Eddy's legitimate interests; and any illegal activities—including piracy, hacking, extortion, blackmail, gambling, copyright infringement and unauthorized access to any computers on the internet or e-mail—are prohibited.
- d. Copyrighted or trademarked materials belonging to entities other than the City of Bruceville-Eddy may not be transmitted by employees or officials on the company's network without permission of the copyright holder. Employees and officials must respect all copyrights and may not copy, retrieve, modify or forward copyrighted materials, except with permission or as a single copy for reference only. Saving copyright-protected information to a network drive without permission is prohibited. Sharing the URL (uniform resource locator or "address") of an internet site with other interested persons for business reasons is permitted.

- e. Employees and officials may not use the system in a way which disrupts its use by others. This includes using a City network or device sending or receiving excessive numbers of large files and "spamming" (sending e-mail to thousands of users.).
- f. To prevent contamination of City of Bruceville-Eddy technology and communications equipment and systems by harmful computer viruses, employees and officials should only download or open files from trusted sources. Also, installing or downloading applications or software is prohibited without prior permission from IT.
- g. Every employee or official of the City of Bruceville-Eddy is responsible for the content of all text, audio, or image files that the employee or official places or sends over the city's internet and e-mail systems. No e-mail or other electronic communication may be sent that hides the identity of the sender or represent the sender as someone else. The City of Bruceville-Eddy's trademark identity is attached to all outgoing e-mail communications, which should reflect City values and appropriate workplace language and conduct as defined in these policies.
- h. E-mail and other electronic communications transmitted by City of Bruceville-Eddy equipment, systems and networks are not private or confidential, and they are the property of the City. Therefore, the City of Bruceville-Eddy reserves the right to examine, monitor and regulate e-mail and other electronic communications, directories, files, and all other content, including internet use, transmitted by or stored in its technology systems, whether onsite or offsite.
- i. Email, voice mail, instant messages and text messages may be considered public records. Employees and officials should be mindful of the possibility of disclosure or production outside the City when communicating either internally or externally and should always comply with the City of Bruceville-Eddy's record retention policy.

Sec. 1.09.004 Right to Monitor

All City of Bruceville-Eddy-supplied technology, including computer systems, equipment, and City-related work records, belongs to City and not to the employee or official user. As stated above, the City of Bruceville-Eddy reserves the right to monitor use patterns, and employees and officials should observe appropriate workplace discretion in their use and maintenance of such City property.

All City of Bruceville-Eddy policies apply to the use of City computer systems and software, as well as e-mail and City internet connections and networks.

Sec. 1.09.005 Cybersecurity

All City of Bruceville-Eddy-owned technology connected to the internet is susceptible to attack and sabotage. Employees and officials accessing technology are required to take measures to safeguard publicly owned information systems by following the current and best practices of the Information Technology Department, or its' contracted entity; to include the regular update of individually assigned password, the avoidance of sharing passwords, the regular locking of computer workstations while physically away, and practicing of neither opening or clicking on links and attachments included in suspicious e-mails and the reporting of such e-mails to IT. Cybersecurity requirements also include the completion of an annual training course for the purpose of providing refresher training and the reciving of updates related to trends in cybercriminal activities that could potentially compromise City owned networks and the resulting loss or damage of public records and infrastructure.

1.09.006 Purpose of Social Media Policy

The term "social media" refers to forms of electronic communication through which users create online communities to share information, ideas, personal messages and other content. The term "social media" encompasses: Twitter, Facebook, LinkedIn, Snapchat, Instagram, Kik, Whisper, blogs, and other online journals and diaries; bulletin boards and chat rooms, microblogging and all other social networking sites, instant messaging and the posting of video on YouTube and similar media.

Many local governments use social media as a tool to communicate with citizens. Rather than waiting until a regularly scheduled council meeting to receive citizen input, city employees and officials are able to instantly interact with them via social media. Although this technology greatly increases communication outreach and efficiency, some restrictions are required in order to comply with federal and state law.

While employees as well as elected officials and City Council-appointed board, committee and commission members ("Public Officials") may maintain and use personal web pages and websites, blogs, and social networking sites, employees and elected/appointed officials should keep their status in mind with regard to the content of their activity on those sites.

The City's image as a professional organization is critical to maintaining the respect of its constituents. Although the City recognizes that employees and elected/appointed officials (hereafter referred to collectively as "officials") may choose to express themselves by posting information upon social media platforms or by making comments on sites hosted by other persons, groups or organizations, by their having accepted the responsibilities of public service, officials likewise have a duty to the City of Bruceville-Eddy and its operations.

If an official or employee conducts any City business or communication from a personal account, business account, or an account created for a board/committee/commission, officials should assume that City-related communications will be considered a public record subject to the Texas Public Information Act.

Sec. 1.09.007 Employees

The City of Bruceville-Eddy understands that many of its employees use social media to share their life and opinions with family, friends, and co-workers. The intent of this policy is to provide guidance for the creation and distribution of information concerning the City, its employees, customers, and vendors through electronic media, including, but not limited to online forums, instant messaging and social media and blogging sites. Employees are responsible for their posts, comments, "likes" or favored, as well as content the employee chooses to share on social media.

Sec. 1.09.008 Use of The City of Bruceville-Eddy's Internet for Access to Social Media

Use of the City of Bruceville-Eddy's internet is a privilege and City's employees must responsibly and ethically use this resource. The City may monitor an employee's access, use, and postings while using the City's internet to: ensure compliance with internal policies; support the performance of internal investigations; assist management of information systems; and for all other lawful purposes. Employees must abide by all federal and state law and policies of City in using City's internet.

Sec. 1.09.009 Use of Personal Social Media by Employees

Postings, whether authorized on behalf of City of Bruceville-Eddy or on the employee's personal social media should be consistent with this policy. Use of social media to publish or send discriminatory or harassing remarks or material, threats of violence or obscene posts by employees of City is prohibited, whether posted on a City site, the employee's personal sites or a third-party's social media page.

- a. Use of personal social media is prohibited during working hours, unless authorized or while an employee is on a break consistent with the City of Bruceville-Eddy employee handbook.
- b. Employees are encouraged to be fair and courteous to co-workers, customers, vendors or anyone who works on behalf of City. Employees are encouraged to use general complaint resolution practices to resolve work-related complaints, rather than social media to report or resolve a complaint. However, if you decide to post complaints or criticism, avoid using statements, photographs, video or audio which reasonably could be viewed as

discriminatory, harassing, malicious, obscene, threatening or intimidating. Examples of such conduct which may be considered to violate this policy include comments, remarks or posts meant to intentionally harm someone's reputation or which contribute to a hostile work environment because of race, sex, disability, religion or any other status protected by law or City policy.

- c. City of Bruceville-Eddy employees are urged to be honest and accurate when posting information or news. If you post something you later learn to not be true, employees should correct or remove the post as soon as possible. Never post statements, remarks or rumors you know to be false about the City of Bruceville-Eddy, its employees, citizens, customers or vendors.
- d. Employees who associate themselves with City of Bruceville-Eddy through their social media by posting the City's logo or identifying themselves as a City employee should take special care to avoid conduct which adversely affects the employee's ability to perform in their job, or the interests of co-workers, customers, vendors or the legitimate business interests of the City. Be clear that statements, remarks, posts and comments are reflective of your opinion and not the City of Bruceville-Eddy's position. Do not represent yourself as a spokesperson for the City. The City of Bruceville-Eddy reserves the right to require an employee remove any logo or association with the City from any or all social media profiles. All marks and City logos remain the exclusive property of City of Bruceville-Eddy.
- e. Employees should not use City of Bruceville-Eddy issued emails or other Company identifiers in creating an employee's personal social media profile.
- f. Do not disclose private or confidential information about a co-worker, citizen, customer, vendor or City's business practices.

Sec. 1.09.010 Use of the City of Bruceville-Eddy's Social Media Accounts

a. Employees must obtain written authorization from the City Administrator or City Secretary or be assigned as part of their job duties to update or post on social media sites on behalf of City of Bruceville-Eddy and City reserves the right to approve material prior to posting. All the employee's time spent updating or posting on the City of Bruceville-Eddy's social media sites as part of the employee's job duties is compensable time that must be reported and counted in the calculation of overtime, where applicable.

- b. Use of social media on work time and on City equipment on City-operated networks is subject to monitoring under these policies, even if password protected or otherwise restricted. City of Bruceville-Eddy reserves the right to access, intercept, monitor and review all information accessed, posted, sent, stored, printed or received through its communications systems or equipment at any time.
- c. Never disclose any confidential information concerning another employee of City of Bruceville-Eddy or the confidential business practices of City of Bruceville-Eddy as those are defined in these policies. Posting of confidential information may violate state law and subject the user to civil or criminal penalty.
- d. All media requests related to social media must be processed through the City Administrator.
- e. Individual supervisors do not have the authority to make exceptions to these guidelines.
- f. The City of Bruceville-Eddy occasionally photographs, records or describes company events for its website, social media pages and/or profiles. Photographs and recordings are made in an open and obvious manner. Employees may step out of a photograph or recording or may submit a written request to the City Secretary to remove a photograph or recording from City's website, social media pages or profiles.
- g. The City of Bruceville-Eddy reserves the right to report posts or comments made on a City social media page or profile which violate the applicable social media platform's community guidelines or terms of use based on the opinion of the authorized account administrator(s) for the City of Bruceville-Eddy.

Sec. 1.09.011 Elected and Appointed Officials: Professional and Personal Conduct Standards

- a. All City Public Officials ("Officials") are expected to conduct themselves in a manner consistent with the City's policies and standards of conduct.
- b. It is anticipated that from time to time, Officials will have access to information that is considered privileged or confidential under Texas State law. Such information is typically considered an exception to the public records law and may have specific penalties for inappropriate disclosure. By way of example, such information may include, but is not limited to, certain personnel information, non-public information from criminal

investigations, and business trade secrets. Officials must not reveal any confidential or privileged information about the City, its constituents, its employees, or its contractors. Officials must be particularly careful to protect against the inadvertent disclosure of confidential or privileged information.

- c. Officials are encouraged to be honest and accurate when posting information or news, and should quickly correct any mistakes, misstatements, and/or factual errors in content upon discovery. Officials should not post or share information known to be false about the City, its employees, constituents, other public officials, suppliers, vendors, or contractors.
- d. Unless the official has been designated to serve as a spokesperson, officials should not represent themselves as a spokesperson for the City Council, a City board or committee, the City administration, or any City department.
- e. Officials are expressly prohibited from using personal or professional social media to engage in any activity or conduct that violates federal, state, or local law. Officials are also prohibited from using professional social media accounts to circumvent election or campaign requirements, in campaigning for re-election, or endorsing other candidates for public office.
- f. Social media content created by elected and appointed officials may be subject to the Texas Public Information Act and the City's records retention policy. Specific inquiries should be directed to the City Administrator.
- g. Officials are subject to the Texas Open Meetings Act. As an example, officials should be mindful that posting content regarding City-related matters could inadvertently result in the violation of the Open Meetings Act if enough other public officials engage on the post, resulting in a quorum. If this occurs, the online conversation should immediately cease with no further posts by the officials and the City Secretary should be notified accordingly.
- h. Officials are prohibited from using social media to engage in any activity that conflicts with their elected or appointed duties to the City.

Sec. 1.09.012 Commenting on City Accounts by Elected and Appointed Officials

The City of Bruceville-Eddy may use social media to send and receive messages about city information, services and related programs with community stakeholders, including employees, vendors, citizens, media and other members of the public.

- a. As with others who engage with the City on social media, elected or appointed officials should understand the City's current guidelines for public participation, which are subject to change as new technology and tools emerge, as well as new regulations and caselaw.
- b. Currently, public comments are not allowed on the City-administered social media accounts.

Sec. 1.09.012 Use of Personal Accounts by Elected and Appointed Officials

As a policy-making body, Council members and City appointees may have latitude to publicly express thoughts and opinions on local issues. However, elected as well as appointed officials should be aware of additional risks related to their general participation on social media.

Public Officials should consider the following when using personal social media accounts:

- a. Removing elected titles from profiles used to identify a personal social media account.
- b. Include an introductory statement in the profile or about section of the account that defines the purpose and topical scope of the page, marking it as a personal and not a public official or governmental page:

"This account is intended for personal use only. The views, postings, positions or opinions expressed on this site are my own and do not represent those of the City of Bruceville-Eddy. If you are a citizen of Bruceville-Eddy and would like to discuss city business, please go to [official page] or contact me at [official email]."

- c. Redirect information to official government sources and avoid making posts related to official duties or governmental bodies.
- d. Redirect political dialogue requests to an alternative means of communication (i.e. email, phone or other preferred social media account).
- e. Avoid commenting on local issues where other Council/Commission/Board members are also participating in discussion.
- f. Avoid making posts and/or comments on behalf of the City and/or the City Council and/or Planning and Zoning Commission or the Board/Committee to which elected or to which appointed.
- g. Avoid making posts and/or comments in your official capacity as an elected or appointed official.
- h. Avoid making posts and/or comments regarding City business.
- i. Avoid responding to inappropriate comments or personal attacks on social media. If the

commenter persists, redirect them to an alternate method of communication (i.e. email).

j. Be aware that a personal social media account, depending on its content, may still be subject to the Public Information Act. Limit open-ended political and city business discussions from your personal social media accounts and redirect dialogue requests to an alternate channel.

Sec. 1.09.013 Exemptions

The City of Bruceville-Eddy Police Department, to include the Police Chief and all full-time and reserve sworn officers, having a different primary mission with different needs, are not subject to this article, but are instead regulated by their own departmental policy regarding social media and access to City owned technology.

Sec. 1.09.014 Questions Regarding the Use of City of Bruceville-Eddy's Network and Technology

If you have questions regarding the appropriate use of City of Bruceville-Eddy electronic communications equipment or systems, including e-mail and the internet, please contact your supervisor, manager, or the IT department.

Sec. 1.09.015 Violation of Policy

This policy is not meant to circumvent or bypass any of the other processes, policies or laws that are applicable to the City Council or City appointed Boards and Committees. Social media activity and conduct by Council members and appointed officials should not only comply with these policy terms, but all other processes, policies and laws that may apply as well.

Any employee who abuses the City-provided access to e-mail, the internet, or other electronic communications or networks, including social media, may be denied future access, and, if appropriate, be subject to disciplinary action up to and including termination, within the limitations of any applicable federal, state or local laws.

This policy also applies to employees as well as elected and appointed officials using the employee's own device to access or use a City of Bruceville-Eddy network, system or account.

Sec. 1.09.016 Other City of Bruceville-Eddy Policies

This policy should be read and interpreted in conjunction with other City of Bruceville-Eddy policies, including but not limited to, policies prohibiting harassment, discrimination, and standards of conduct.

Violations of the Social Media Policy may lead to disciplinary action consistent with these policies, up to and including termination.

Sec. 1.09.017 Policy Updates

The City Council reserves the right to update these terms of use at any time.

SECTION 3. It is the intent of the City Council that each clause, phrase, sentence, paragraph, section, or subsection of this Ordinance be deemed severable, and should such clause, phrase, sentence, paragraph, section, or subsection be declared invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such declaration of invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not be construed to affect or impair the validity of those provisions of this Ordinance left standing, or the validity of any other ordinance of the City of Bruceville-Eddy.

SECTION 4. The City of Bruceville-Eddy Code of ordinances shall remain in full force and effect save and except as amended herein.

SECTION 5. This Ordinance shall be and is hereby declared to be cumulative of all other ordinances of the City of Bruceville-Eddy, and this Ordinance shall not operate to repeal or affect any of such other ordinances except insofar as the provisions thereof might be inconsistent or in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance, in which event such conflicting provisions, if any, in such other ordinance or ordinances are hereby repealed.

SECTION 6. The City Secretary is hereby directed to engross and enroll this Ordinance by copying the exact Caption and Effective Date clause in the minute of the City Council and by filing this Ordinance in the Ordinance records of the City.

SECTION 7. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its adoption and publication in accordance with and as provided by law.
